Ken Benson will give a report of his two weeks in Mexico with "Operation Mobilization"

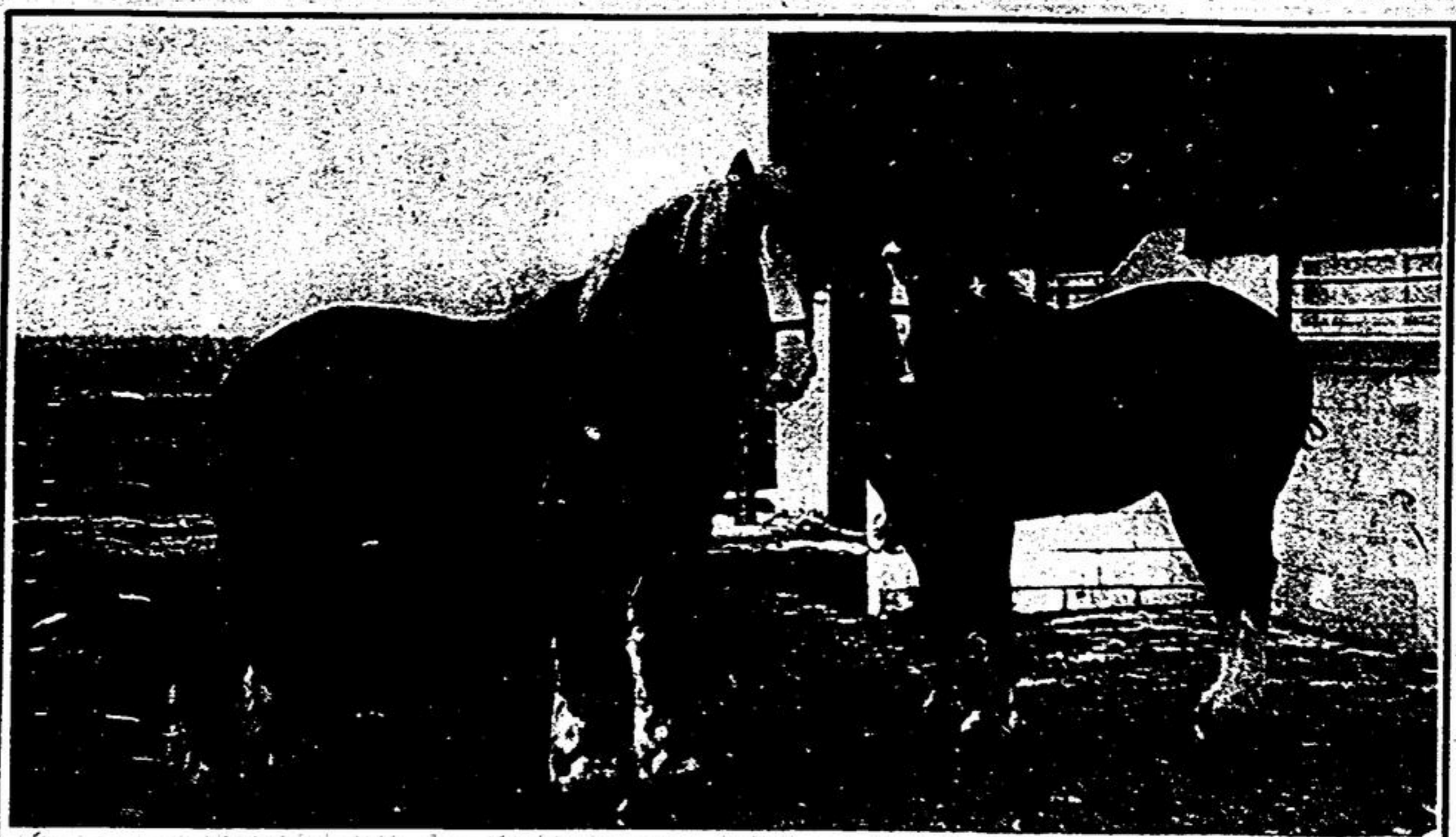
at 7:30 p.m., Sunday, Jan. 27 in the Missionary Church.
