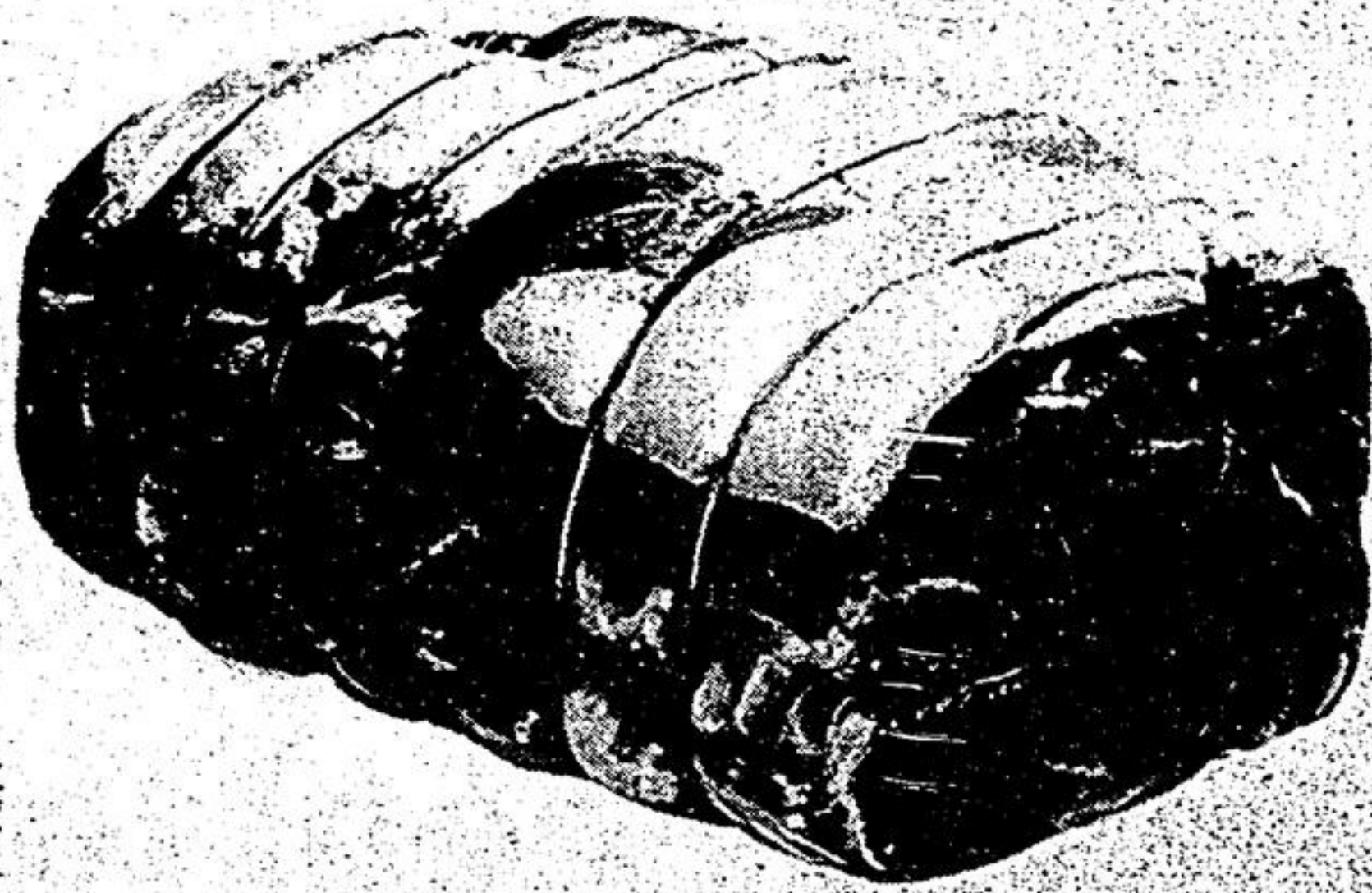

A fireman with 34 years experience, Walter Smith was recently appointed full-time Chief with the Whitchurch-Stouffville Department. Walt assumes his position officially, Feb. 4, with inspections of all public buildings a top priority.

Fire Chief — Walter Smith

Inspections are a top priority

STOUFFVILLE — On Monday, Feb. 4, Whitchurch-Stouffville will have a full-time fire chief. This important position will be filled by Walter Smith, no stranger to the Town or the department. He's been a member of the local brigade since September, 1946 and Chief on a part-time basis since '59. He succeeded the late Wm. Malloy.

Heading Chief Smith's list of priorities is a personal inspection of all business places in Town as well as public buildings including churches. Interior drawings will be completed and kept on file along with a contact number in case someone's needed after hours. Chief Smith will also visit private homes but only on request.

Inspection of large industrial firms and schools are already complete.

After Feb. 4, the firehall will be Chief Smith's "second home". However, most of his time will be spent outside the office. Clerical duties will be handled in part by Debbie Bond of the Town staff.

Walter's the first to admit "you can't

do everything at once." However, he hopes to have a radio-equipped car supplied by the municipality and perhaps a full-time assistant in 1981.

Chief Smith says he's enjoyed excellent co-operation from Councils both past and present. He feels Whitchurch-Stouffville, for its size, has a well-equipped fire department. He's pleased with dispatcher service provided by Markham and the "beeper" system that warns volunteers of calls even before the siren sounds.

The Chief has high praise for his men. All have completed St. John Ambulance courses and the majority are licensed to perform cardio-pulmonary resuscitation. The heads of departments in adjacent areas have been good too, he says, especially Jim Davidson of Vaughan, York Region's mutual aid co-ordinator.

"Does this full-time post mean he'll no longer ride the big red truck out of town?" Not on your life, Chief Smith replied, it would break my heart if I couldn't.
