Take notice that the Regional Municipality of Durham is considering AN AMENDMENT TO THE DURHAM REGIONAL OFFICIAL PLAN

In order to assist in the evaluation of the proposed amendment, the public is invited to provide input by way of submissions to the Region's Planning Department. The purpose of the proposed amendment is to prevent the undue concentration of group homes in Residential Areas and therefore to add a new Section 8.1.2.1. (part c) which reads as follows:

c) It is the intention of this Plan to prevent undue concentrations of group homes within Residential Areas. The Council of the respective area municipality may incorporate standards requiring a minimum distance separation between these facilities in the respective restricted area (zoning) By-Law.
