Despite a two week lay-off, the Bears met Bowmanville, at home, on February 11, and won 3-1. The visitors opened the scoring within one minute of the face-off, and the Bears tied the score late in the period, with a goal by Danny Larmer, from Brad May's rebound.

The second period was deadlocked with no score and the game was decided in the final frame.

The Bears' second goal came when defenceman Darryl Ham slipped the puck to Brad May, beside the Bowmanville goal. May's high shot went in over the goalie's shoulder.

Sven Henze ensured Stoffville's win when he stole the puck from the Bowmanville defence and easily beat their netminder.

Scott Evans made several key saves between the Stoffville pipes.

In their second game, at Bowmanville, the Bears had complete control of the game. Aaron McWilliams gave Darron Baston the puck, inside his own blue line, for a nice breakout down the ice to score with a high, hard shot. Baston's second goal came when his pass deflected off a Bowmanville player's skate, into the net.

At mid-point, Bowmanville scored their only goal of the game.

Baston completed his hat-trick when he picked up Danny Larmer's rebound. On a three way play, along with Darron Baston and Aaron McWilliams, Larmer skated around the goalie to make it 4-1.

Final goal in the game went to Craig Stronach, who picked the short side, after shots by May and Larmer failed, for a convincing 5-1 win.

Continuing their sweeping first round wins the Bears wrapped it all up on Monday evening when they dumped Bowmanville, yet again, for a 4-0 victory. Scott Evans earned the Bears' shutout.

Earlier this month, Vic and Cathy Carcone held yet another very successful Sunday Schooling show, with a rather large entry in the English and Western Pleasure class.

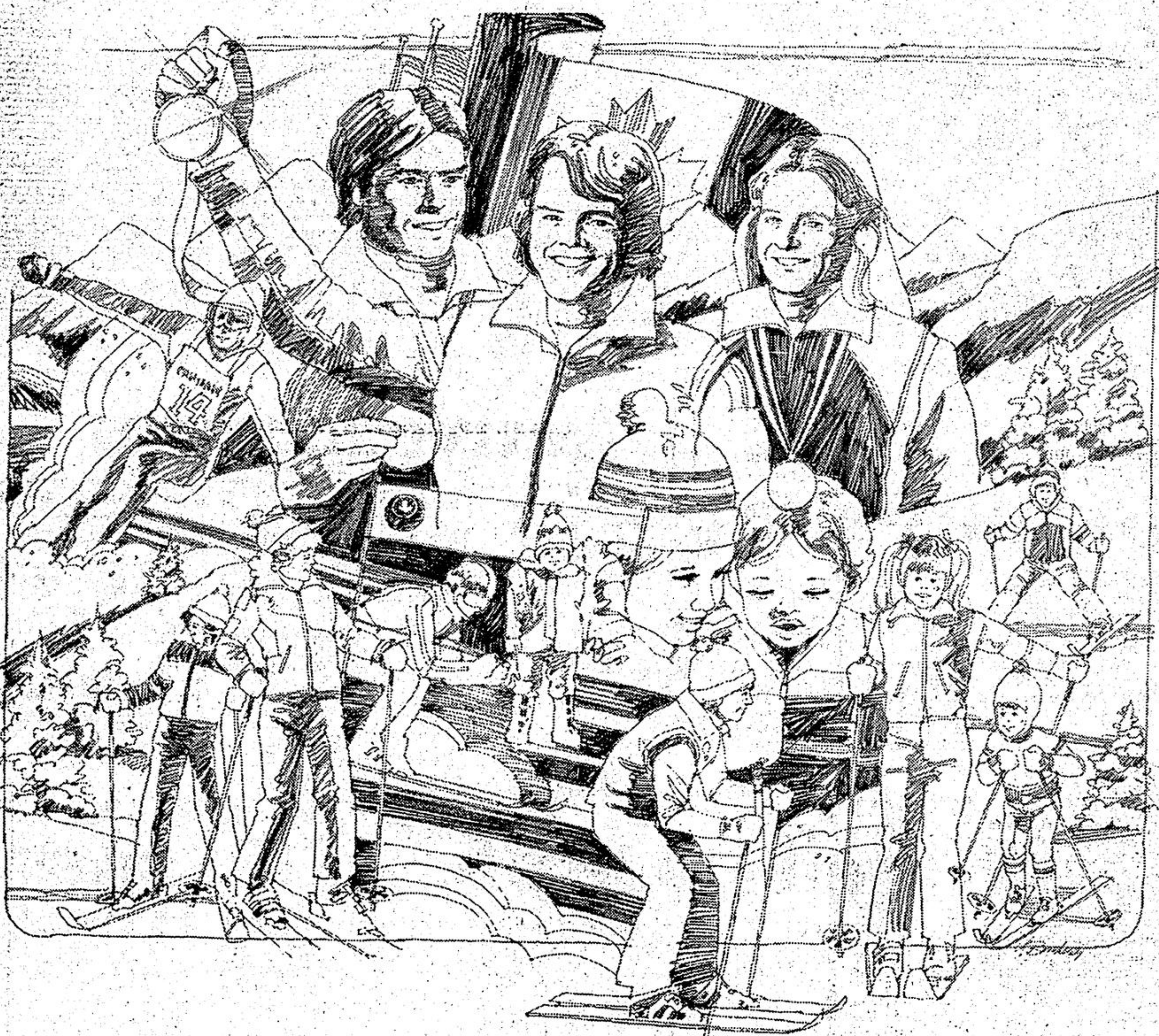

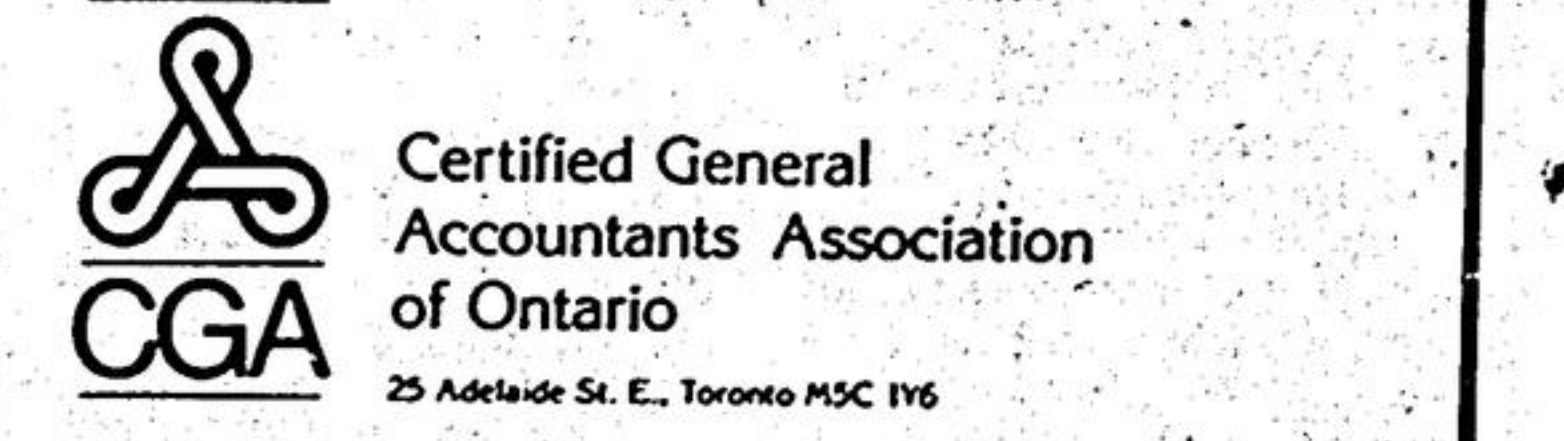
