## Mite division

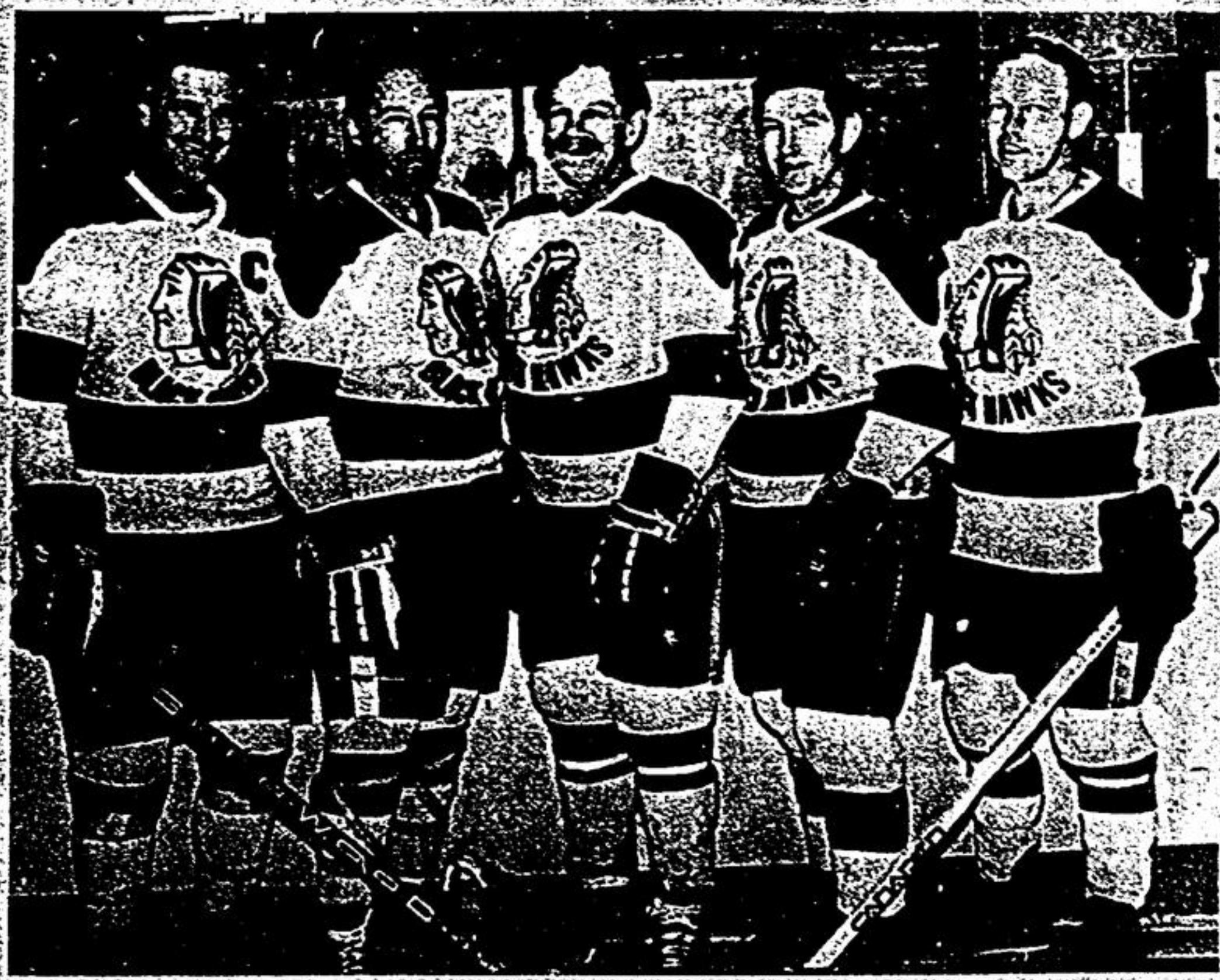
STOUFFVILLE Over the past three years youth soccer in Stouffville has become a mighty popular. This year however, soccer will be just plain Mite - for the little mites that is!

Whitchurch Stouffville Soccer Club Mite Division Vice President Doug Gilbert explained that for the younger players a modified game called "mini soccer" is now advocated by the club.

"We're hoping for a very good response from parents of five, six and seven-year-old girls and boys (children born in '72, '73 and '74)," said Gilbert. "Our aim is to form a Mite Division Mini Soccer League

within Whitchurch-Stouffville. This means that all games will be at home and will finish early enough for the primary school aged child. Best of all, this soccer is modified to suit the smaller, younger kids.

Mini soccer has almost everything scaled down. Smaller teams allow the coach to give more personal attention to each player. Fewer players on the field give everyone a good chance to really participate. A smaller field means frequent scoring opportunities and a playing area geared to the player's physical capacities. A smaller goal gives the goal-keeper a realistic chance to be
