Testing

By Lyne Couturier **STOUFFVILLE** - It's a recurring problem. Every year, students entering university or college are accused of lacking basic skills they should have mastered in high school.

Standardized testing of grade 10 and 12 students hopes to change that. Gordon Wells, Testing Officer for the York County Board of Education, explained this process at Orchard Park Public School.

This assessment was introduced in the early 1970's involving grade four and seven students. It wasn't until last Sept. that it was expanded into the high schools.

The areas tested are mathematics and reading. The tests are spread out over a two and three year period to see how the students are progressing. Once the teacher has the results he can focus on problem areas and plan programs around these needs.

This can also have reverse effects. If some people scored exceptionally well, courses can be designed for these bright students.

Mr. Wells explained that many factors can affect a student's performance on a test. Teachers must interpret the results.

Another purpose of this method is to compare results of York County with the rest of Ontario. However, Mr. Wells stressed that this is not the major function.

"We don't want teachers or trustees to simply compare our schools' progress with other areas. If there are problems action should be taken to remedy the situation," he said.
