AN AMENDMENT TO THE DURHAM REGIONAL OFFICIAL PLAN

to permit the reclaiming and/or recycling of material with areas designated Industrial in the Durham Regional Official Plan, and therefore, to relace the first sentence of Section B.4.2.1, which reads as follows:

"Lands designated on Map 'A' as Industrial Areas shall mean that the predominant use of lands so designated shall be for manufacturing, warehousing, assembly, processing, storage of goods and raw materials, utility functions and transportation terminals and similar uses"

with the following:

"Lands designated on Map 'A' as Industrial Areas shall mean that the predominant use of lands so designated may be for manufacturing, warehousing, assembly, processing, including reclaiming and/or recycling, storage of goods and materials, utility functions and transportation terminals and similar uses"
