Hunger Meal

RINGWOOD — Members of Ringwood Christian Church Sunday School participated in a Hunger Meal, led by Pastor Jim Byrne, March 30.

with the song, "Count your Blessings", and a Scripture reading promising a blessing for helping the poor. The purpose of the exercise was to help the congregation remember Christ's wilderness

temptation, and to enable members to identify more personally with the hungry of the world. A discussion of how much is assumed in today's society and how often, revealed that many people snack up to eight

times daily, while about two-thirds of the world's population exists on a daily ration of food equal in average value to about 13 Canadian cents.

The congregation then selected and ate 13 cents worth of food from a menu consisting of such simple fare as crackers, cheese slices, hard boiled eggs, carrot sticks, and milk. This proved just how little food many people really have.

The price of a candy bar or a cup of coffee would be equivalent to three days supply of food for many. The meeting concluded with a discussion of how food supplies can be conserved, and suggestions included re-cycling leftovers, and eating less meat.

Message of Easter lost

STOUFFVILLE — "It may be because the Church has made the cross such a work of art, that the real message is lost."

Rev. Ted Green, St. James Presbyterian, guest speaker at the Good Friday Ecumenical service, April 4 at Stouffville United, spoke on the theme of "The Contemporary Cross."

"The cross Jesus died on was not made of precious metals or jewels; it was bloody and dirty. The real cross was not pretty."

He commented on the sparsely-attended Good Friday service.

The problems of the church are meaningful to so few. Most would rather pass by than stop and take responsibility."

Rev. Green said that many get carried away with bunnies and chocolates and forget what the day is really all about.

"Too often we miss Jesus on our way to Easter celebrations," he added. "To deny suffering, is also to deny joy. We must come to grips with the cross in today's world to truly understand the meaning of this special day."
