

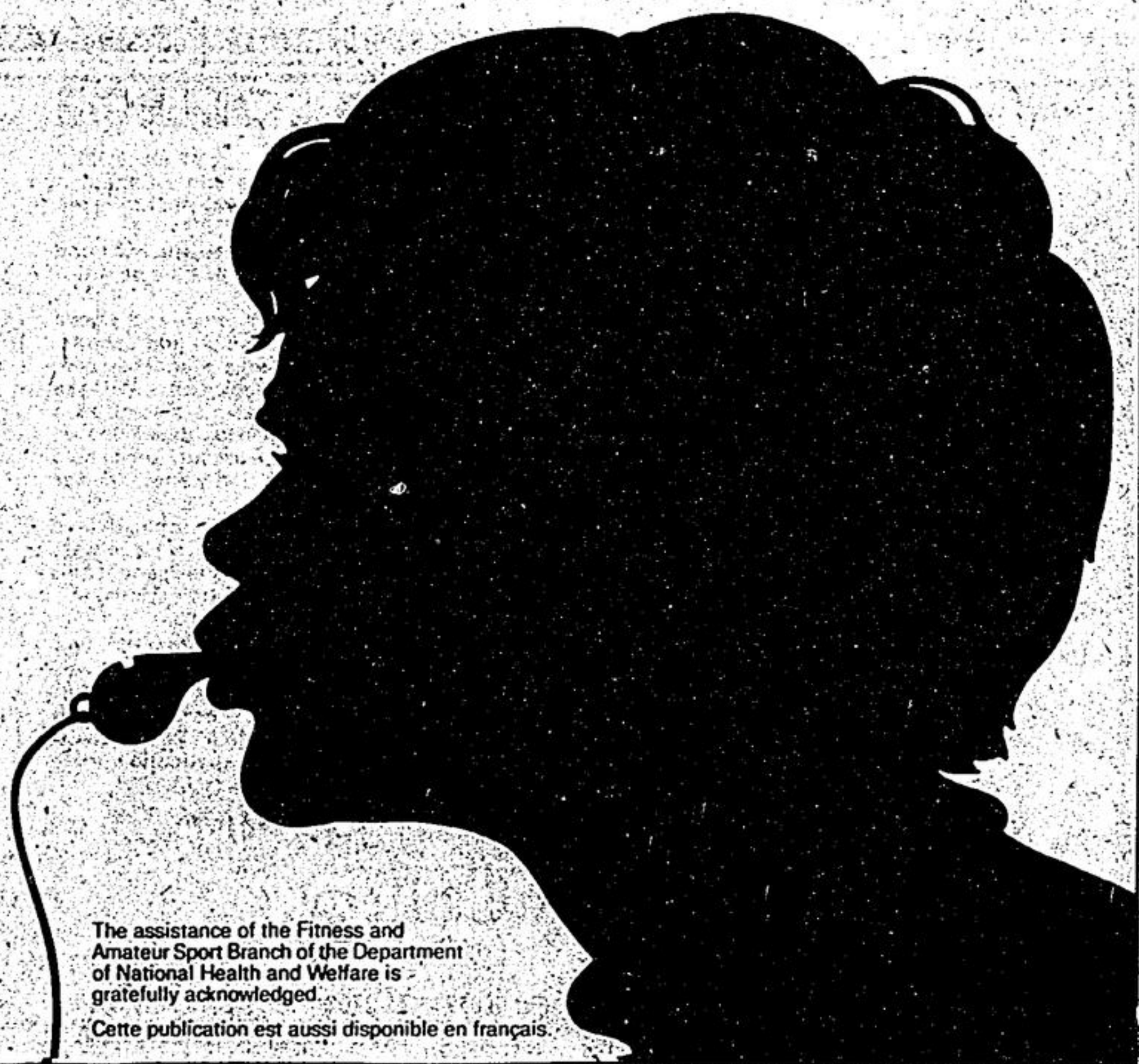
FAIR PLAY FOR SALE
