Dog problems no solutions
"Like prostitution"
 STOUFFVILLE — "Dog control is like prostitution — you can legislate against it, but you can't stop it." Councillor Bill Kamp's made the comparison in voicing strong opposition to a decision to appoint a Town animal control officer, during an all-day committee meeting Monday. "I don't think we'll get better service by hiring one man for such a big job. Within a year, he'll want an assistant, and then where'll we be? Then if it doesn't work out, how can we fire a man on the spot? Chief administration officer, Harold Caldwell, reminded councillors that since the Kennel Inn contract expires April 30, it was urgent to decide what type of service the Town wanted. He outlined three alternatives — an extension of the present agreement; a contract with Ann Barrett; or the hiring of a municipal employee at a salary of \$17,000. Councillor Bill McNalley said the municipality would have greater control over the quality of service provided. "The officer will get to know the dogs and their owners, and familiarize himself with the area. We'll also be able to maintain better public relations within the municipality." His motion to hire the control officer was seconded by Councillor Becky Wedley. Mayor Eldred King advised committee members that no matter how effective any public relations campaign is, there will still be problems. "Markham provides effective service, but I still hear some complaints. I think that if the idea we're voting on doesn't work, we'll be increasing our overhead in the long run."
