MARKHAM — The engineering committee, Region of York, has recommended approval of land acquisition related to the widening of the Ninth Line, south of Hwy. 7.

The total amount of money involved is \$23,273.00.

Terms of the agreement in both instances are - payment of the vendors' legal fees and reconstruction of farm entrances. In the transaction involving Mr. Little, the owner, has asked that a wire fence be erected along the new property line.
