STOUFFVILLE — The Stouffville Family Life Centre is celebrating "Family Unity Month" in May.

Several programs are planned, including a seminar on "Stages of Marriage" in the United Church on Wed., May 21.

The keynote speaker will be Dr. Ronald Myhr, psychologist at the Ontario Institute for Studies in Education, Toronto.

Dr. Myhr lives at Claremont where he has a private practice in psychology limited to marital and relationship therapy, personal counselling and psychotherapy. Time of the seminar is 8 p.m.

On Wed., May 28, a workshop entitled "Communications in the Family" will be held at 8 p.m. in St. James Presbyterian Church.

Sylvia Rosenberg, Director of the Stouffville Family Life Centre will focus attention on specific parenting skills and communication concepts within the family.

The Stouffville Family Life Centre has been in operation here for

three years. The office open every Tuesday in the Stouffville Credit Union Building, 96 Main Street West, offers marital, family and individual counselling.

A newly formed education committee is striving to bring into focus, health and preventative measures

that will enrich family life.

With regard to summer jobs (grass-cutting, trimming, raking etc.), none of the students can be tied down past June 11, so other arrangements must be made after that date possibly through the Guidance Department, Mr. Rehill stated.


