

# Medals galore

**STOUFFVILLE** — Gymnasts from Stouffville's Orchard Park, St. Marks and Summitview schools put in some fine performances, May 13, bringing home a total of 14 medals from an area 2 meet held at York University.

Jennifer Tosney, St. Marks, was a top competitor in the Intermediate class, capturing a gold medal in the vault, a silver in the beam and a bronze in the floor. Summitview's Le-

anne Mumford won two medals in the Elite division, a gold for her beam routine and a silver in the vault. Rebecca Ness led the way for Orchard Park gymnasts, winning a gold medal on the beam and a bronze in both the floor and vault events, all in the junior division. Other Orchard Park winners were - Primary, Tracy Emery, gold in vault; Junior, Diane Eidt, gold in floor - Mary Sled,

fourth in vault and fourth in beam; Intermediate, Dorothy Eidt, fourth in floor - Leslie Stronach, fourth in beam; Elite, Elizabeth Sled, bronze in floor - Charmaine Lintner, fourth in beam. Other Summitview winners were - Junior, Lisa Boyd, silver in beam - Heather Johannessen, fourth in floor; Intermediate, Heather Glenn, bronze in beam; Elite, Leanna Grabish, bronze in vault and fourth in floor.

## SDSS Track teams

# Place 5th

**STOUFFVILLE** — Stouffville District Secondary School track and field team had a fine day, May 14, placing fifth out of 18 schools in the York County Championships held at York University.

SDSS qualified 21 athletes in 34 events, plus three relay teams, for the upcoming Georgian Bay Championships.

Dave Dart led SDSS with winning performances in the senior boys discus and shot put. Dave beat the previous discus record in each of his five throws, finally setting a new mark of 47.40 metres. He also putted the shot 12.94 metres.

In the senior girls division, M. Calderone came first in the long jump with a leap of 4.60 metres, and a fourth in the hurdles in a time of 19.6 seconds.

Dawn Baggs brought home another first for SDSS, leaping 4.85 metres

Therefore, it is felt that an open letter on behalf

of all parents to the Whitchurch Stouffville Soccer Club would be in order. It is as follows:

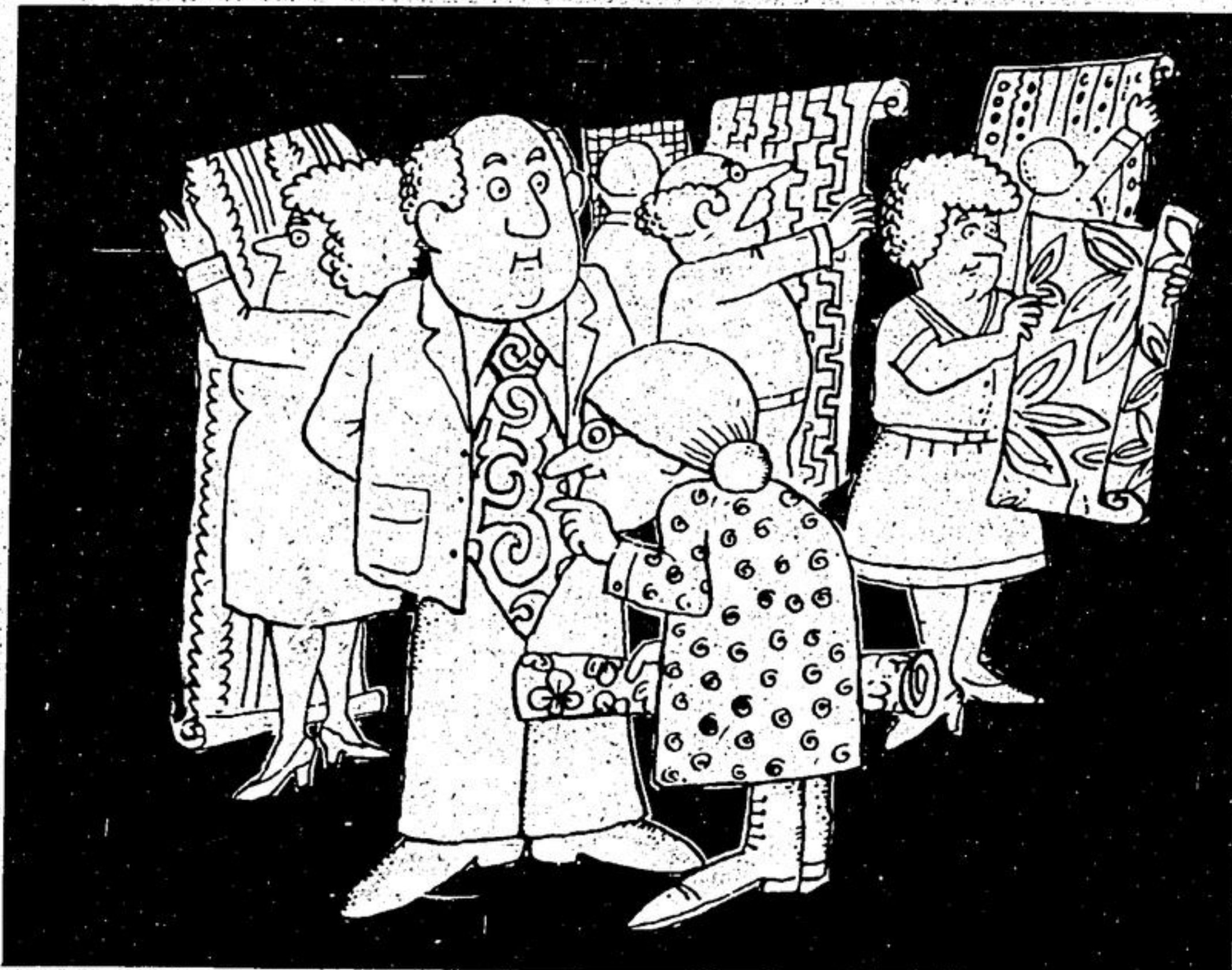

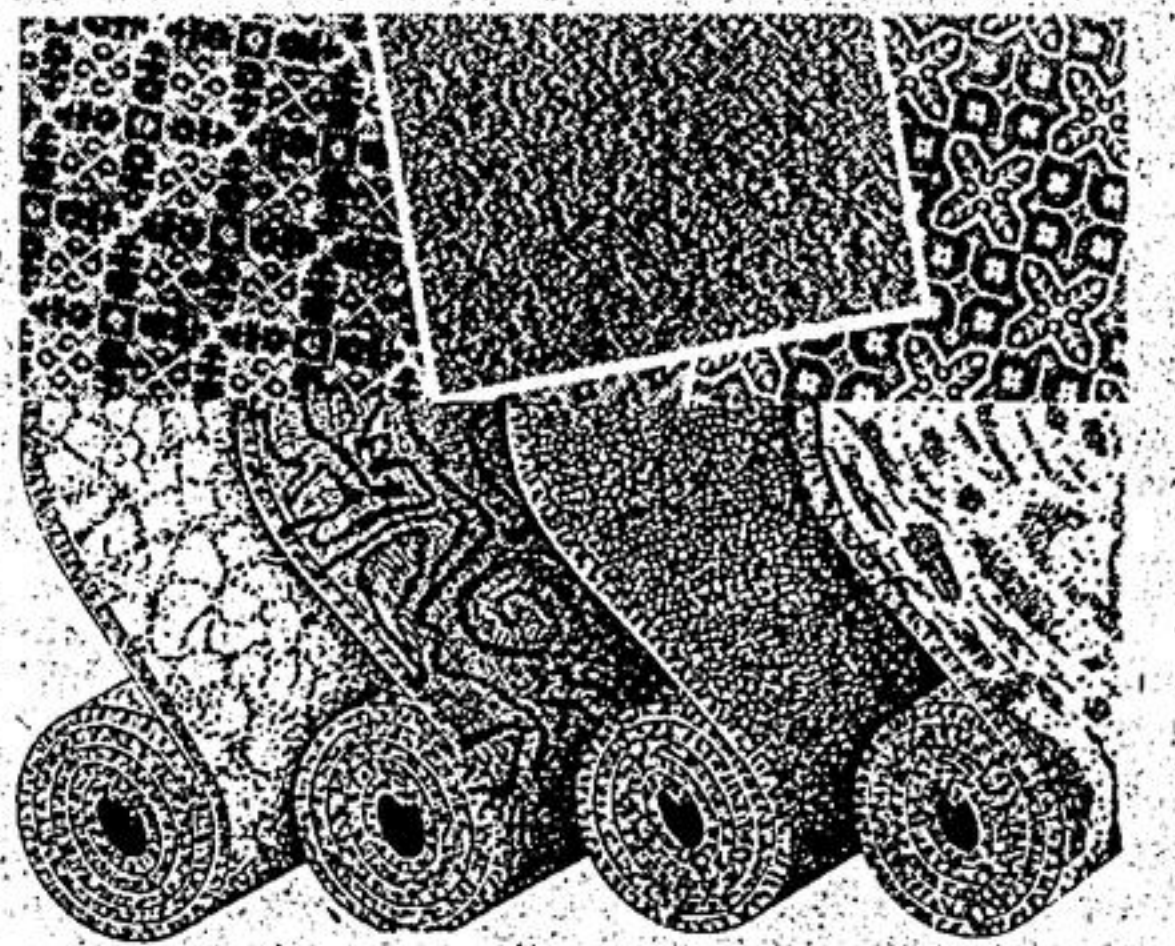

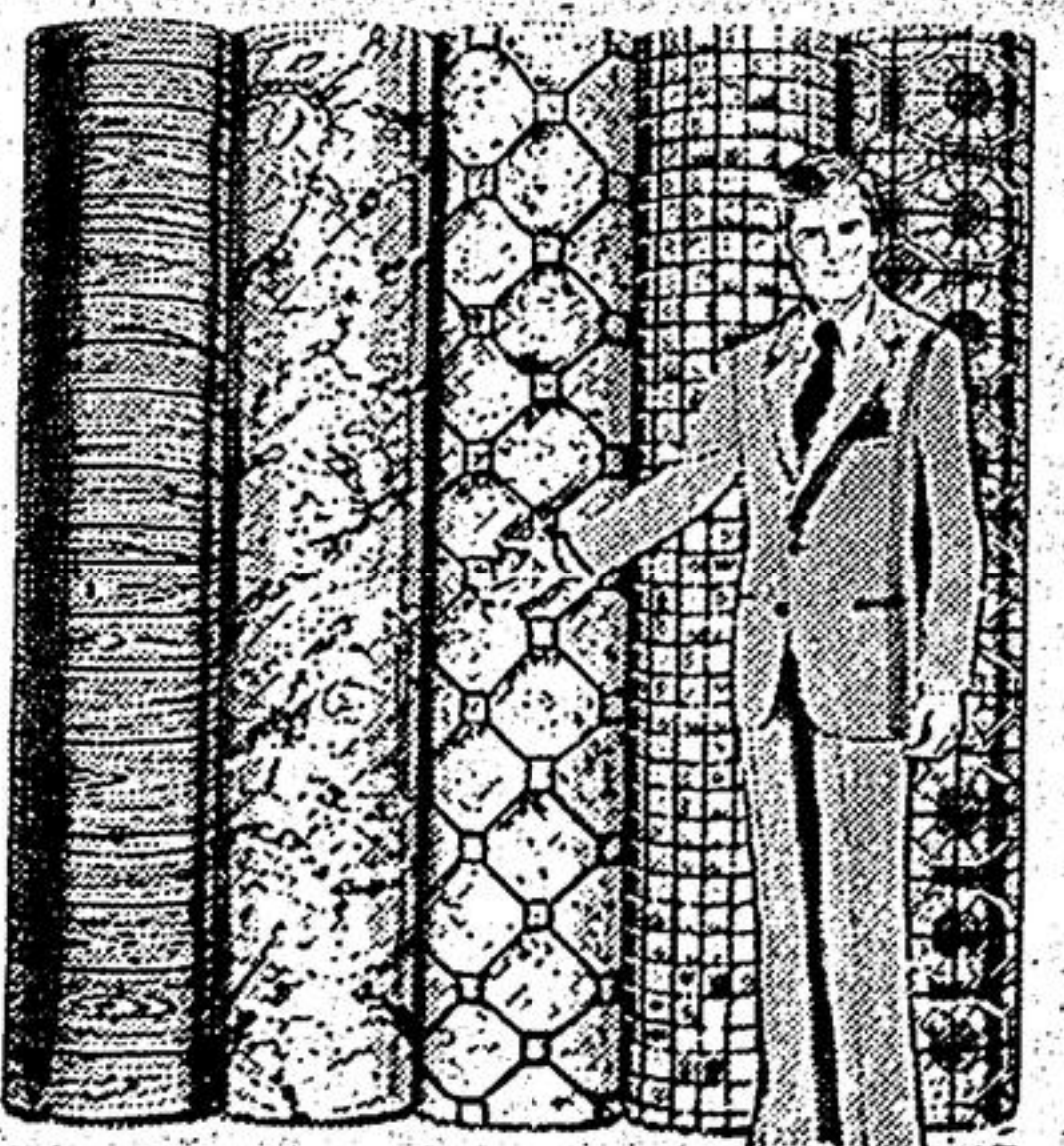
