



MEETING THE NEEDS OF THE COMMUNITY RECREATION




MARKHAM CENTENNIAL CENTRE — Located on McCowan Road, north of Hwy. 7, the centre offers an extensive summer entertainment program featuring popular band concerts, dances and public swimming in the new modern pool, as well as public ice skating and junior hockey in the winter months. Physical fitness activities are also available in the newly constructed fitness centre addition of this complex.




THORNHILL COMMUNITY CENTRE — The centre is located at the corner of John St. and Bayview Ave. in Thornhill and offers some of the finest recreational facilities in Ontario. Designed and built for the people of Markham, Unionville and Thornhill.



CROSBY MEMORIAL ARENA — Located on Kennedy Road in Unionville, the arena was recently renovated by the joint efforts of the local community and the Markham Town Council. It is the home of the Unionville Skating Club, Unionville Minor Hockey Association, and various power skating and hockey schools. Further renovations and improvements are planned for 1978 & 1979.



MARKHAM COMMUNITY CENTRE — The centre is located at the corner of Hwy. 7 and Hwy. 48 in the heart of the Old Town. The centre hosted the Markham Fair since it was constructed in the early 1960's, and provides the area with winter ice skating and junior hockey, and summer roller skating and various other programs.
