Sex education support

DURHAM REGION — Durham Region's proposed family life program for its schools, has found support from Durham Council of Home and School Associations.

The latter voiced agreement at a meeting

of council last week, along with seven other groups and individuals.

The course, an optional one, covers sex education, and has been proposed for all 96 schools in the region from kindergarten up.

Ted Shiner, a teacher and spokesman for the association, presented a brief on its behalf.

"We entrust our children to them (the teachers) in every other subject and see no reason

why we can't do the same with the family life course," he said.

The majority of parents want the program and the majority of the students need it, Shiner said.

The course includes classes in puberty, sexual intercourse, birth, marriage and child-rearing.

Anne Liebrock, a Pickering mother of two, also spoke in support.

"Children have a right to know," she said, "especially in a world I'm probably not prepared for."

She said that her only criticism of the program was that it wasn't around when she was growing up.

Other groups supporting the course were: Sunset Heights Parent Advisory Committee, Sunset Heights Home and School Executive, Southwood Park Public School Home and School Association in Ajax.

Several parents also spoke in favor.

Families re-united


