### Art show praised

William Moore, whose current art show will be at Latham Gallery until July 2, says that his wish is "to lay before the viewer apparent time moments. What is important is to look and to connect."

Judging from his seven paintings, four of which have already been sold, he has done just that.

Certainly, it's hard not to be connected, as it were, on first entering the show, for Moore's subjects almost beckon. And, if as he says, they are moments in time, they are sublime ones, well worth wandering among.

Most of his works, acrylic on canvas, feature clouds—is that God's eye peering from one of them? And, whether they are meant to be anything else than what they are, is immaterial, the colors are strong and rich, and, in some cases, delicately soft, as if pushed together by a gentle breeze.

The diversity is noted in some of the comments: "Good display," writes one viewer. "Obsession with clouds commendable, but I prefer variety. William Moore does not drop enough acid."

"Idiot," is the immediate rejoinder from another viewer, commenting on the remark, not the show.

A third viewer then writes: "Just a beautiful exciting show."

That the artist doesn't appear to "drop" any acid, is part of the show's strength. He is obviously a man with a feeling for his subject and knows definitely just how he wants to present it.

However, if you prefer your art clear and not cloudy, there are a couple of other works
