Freedom land

On May 17, Kha Keophila, his wife Pheung, son Khin and daughters Lee, Vanha, Chan and Dom arrived in Toronto from a Cambodian refugee camp where they'd been living for the past three years.

The family, sponsored by Springvale Baptist Church, was located through the efforts of the Overseas Missionary Fellowship which made the needs of the Keophilas known to the congregation and also provided follow-up visits and aided in immigration details.

Recently, in a moving testimony, given at Springvale Baptist, Mr. Keophila spoke through an interpreter about his flight from Laos where he had practiced dentistry.

All was left behind as his family fled across the Mekong River by night, crowded into two small boats with several other people.

In the confusion of the landing in Thailand, their eldest daughter was lost and, despite an intensive search, was never found. Rejected in Bangkok because of his refugee status, Mr. Keophila was forced to return to the camp in July, 1977.

Since their arrival in

the Stouffville area, they have been provided with accommodation on the 7th Concession (McCowan Road). The children completed their year at Whitechurch - Highlands School and now the entire family is enrolled in an intensive English language training course that will better equip them to adjust to a new way of life in a new country and community.

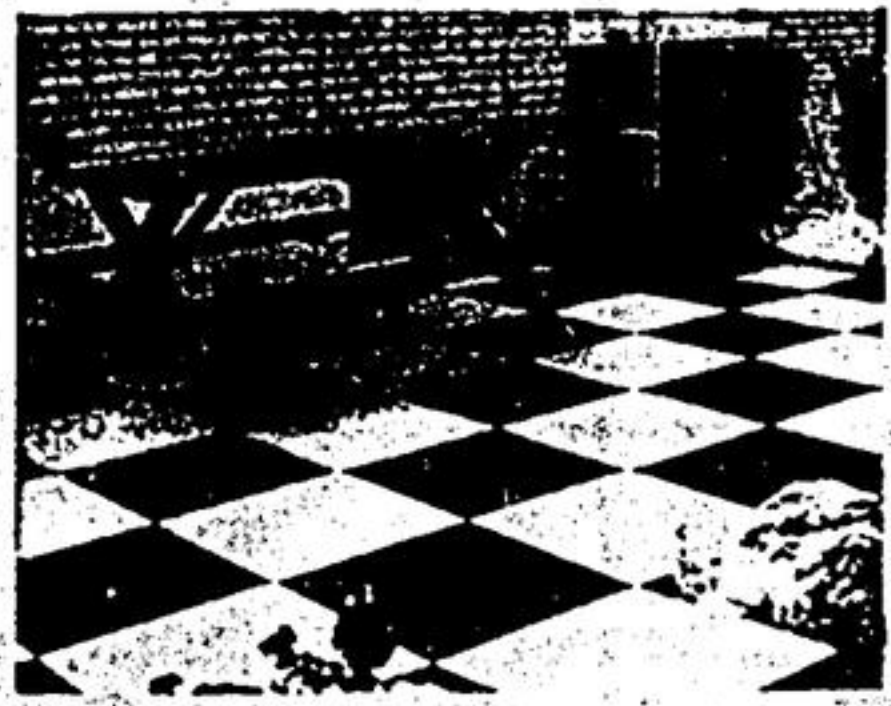
