Oshawa Markham Unionville

Reach finals

STOUFFVILLE — Having already been defeated by Oshawa earlier in the day, Markham were faced with an unenviable outcome. Either they lost the final and settled for second place, or win, and play yet another game against Oshawa to decide the championship.

It was obvious by this time that both teams were pretty well spent after two days of very hard ball, and it is doubtful if either would have welcomed playing back-to-back.

Oshawa took the initiative with a two run lead at the end of the second innings and never lost it.

Early errors by Markham betrayed their tiredness, yet they continued to show great team spirit throughout the game. In the latter stages they even made a comeback and chalked up four runs. However, a powerful finish by Oshawa gave them a 7-4 win.

Oshawa, Markham and Unionville will now advance to the All Ontario championships, to be held at Guelph this coming week-end.

Pride was salvaged when they downed Uxbridge 2-0. The same team that had defeated them 2-1 earlier in the week, in a league game. The game turned into a pitching duel, in which Stouffville's Liz Crittenden edged the Uxbridge pitcher 15-14 in strike-outs. Bernice Armet walked her way to second before coming in on Liz Gibb's hit, and Sheila Fockler pounded a triple in the seventh to steal home for the insurance run.

Pickering put the Stouffville squad out of the running with a first innings 3 run lead that Stouffville could not get back. Liz Crittenden and Sheila Fockler made a gallant attempt to put the team back in the running with runs in the third and fourth innings, to make it 5-3. Unfortunately, the effort ended there. In the next three innings it was only Bernice Armet who could muster a hit.

Meanwhile, the big guns continued to blast their way through to the finals until only Unionville, Markham and Oshawa were left to decide the outcome.

In a three way play off for top honors Markham downed Unionville with a convincing 18-5 win, which assured them of at least a silver; Unionville automatically qualified for a third place bronze.
