Kids recycle too

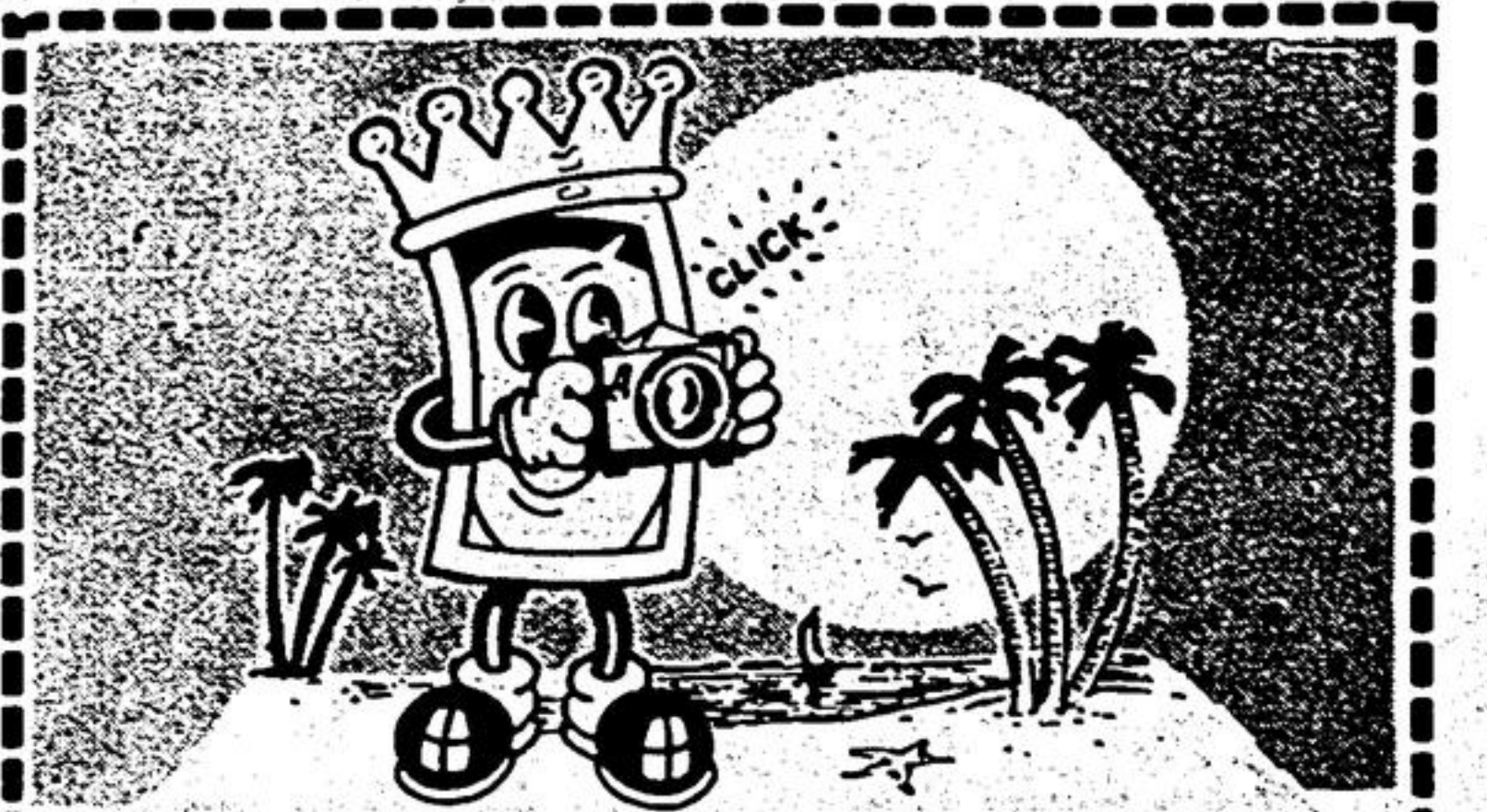
