 That's the show scheduled for October - the second of the season - when local and area artists will roll into the parking lot in vans and display the works on the sides of their vehicles.
 The van art show will also feature photo sketches inside on the gallery walls.
 The show will be produced by Robert Andrews of Seagrave, Ont.
 The opening program in the fall series, which runs till January, will feature the versatile Canadian sculptor, William Lishman of Blackstock, Ont., in September.
 Lishman, currently employed on a number of sculptural pieces for Canada's Wonderland Park in Maple, will show some of his metal works.
 Here is a list of the balance of programs:
 November - Multimedia dance, featuring live performances by dancer Joan Phillips, plus videotapes, still presentations and paintings; co-ordinated by gallery director, John Richmond, R.C.A.; of Claremont.
 December - Amateur photofest. Local photographers may pick up entry forms at the gallery, George Ross Studio, Markham Photo Centre, and all York Regional libraries. Forms will be published in The Tribune.
 January - Print making; an exhibition of silk screen lithography, etching, wood cuts, monoprints, with examples of original screens, plates and stones. Editions will be on sale. Donald Morrison, Glen Major, is the coordinator.

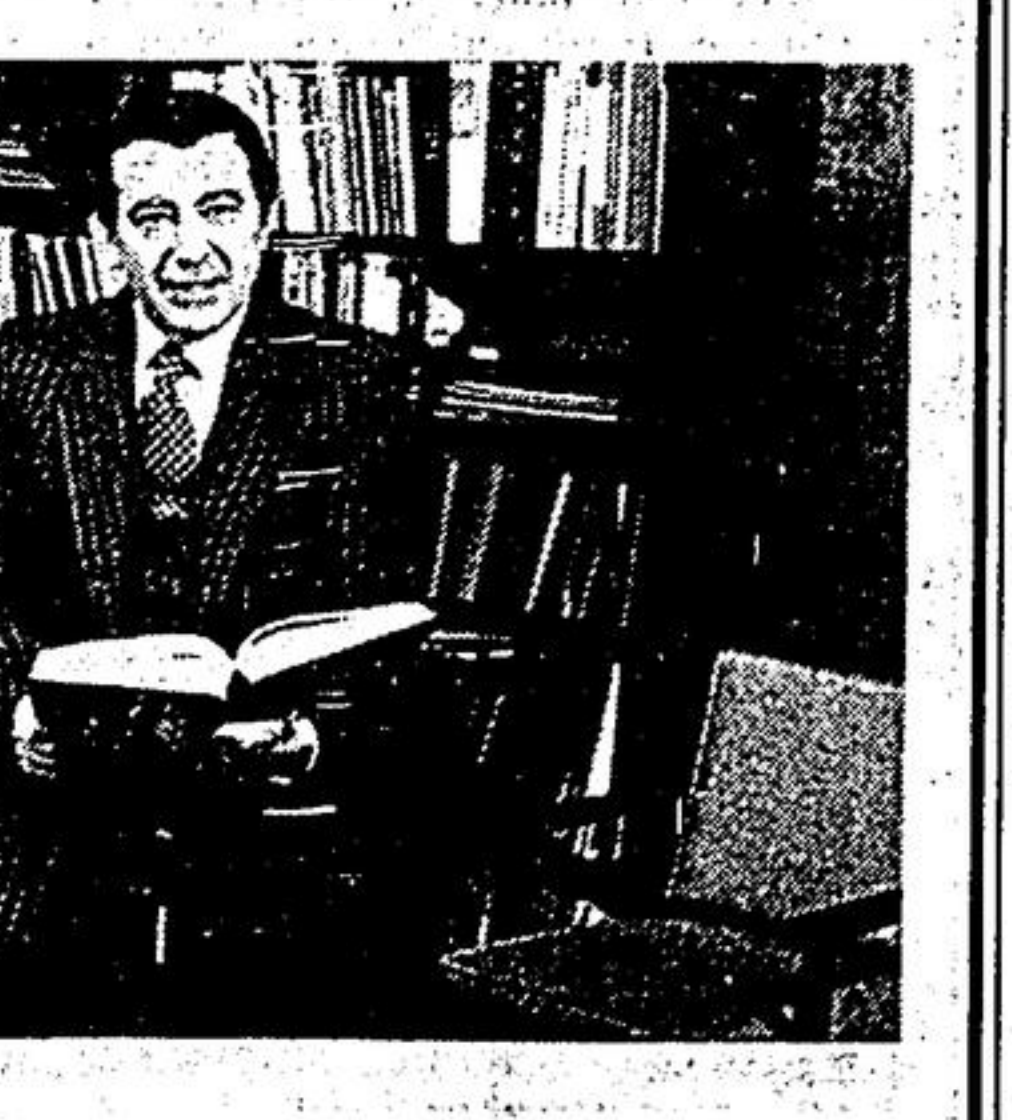
Rejection of races
