McNeil Laboratories

Responsible to the town

STOUFFVILLE — McNeil Laboratories (Canada) Limited is a company with a creed that starts out by saying: "We are responsible to the community in which we live and work."

This represents no idle boast. The firm, in fact, lives by every word.

Since coming to Town, just about three years ago, McNeil has established itself as an excellent corporate citizen. One generous gesture was the leasing of land to the Whitchurch-Stouffville Soccer Club. On it, the league has established five individual fields for its 400 players.

The beauty of its building, both by daylight and dark, has prompted much favorable comment. Not to be overlooked is the fact the firm is one of the largest tax contributors in Town.

The company's history dates back to 1879. Its founder was a Scotsman by the name of Robert McNeil. Twenty-one years ago, it was acquired by the multinational corporation of Johnson & Johnson and is now part of a massive operation in 50 countries around the world, employing 60,000 people.

In addition to its manufacturing plant, McNeil carries out important clinical testing of company products prior to their submission to federal agencies for appraisal and approval.

The firm is the largest manufacturer of over-the-counter analgesic products in North America.

This extremely modern facility operates to very rigid specifications. Materials and finished goods are subjected to countless inspections.

With the exception of its American president, Lester Gagnon, McNeil's is totally staffed by Canadians. There are 115 employees at the

Stouffville plant with responsibilities ranging from administration, marketing and manufacturing to research, shipping and maintenance. In addition, 38 men and women call on physicians, wholesale and retail pharmacies and hospitals coast to coast. The Stouffville plant boasts 85,000 square feet of floor space, with room for expansion. Already, a committee has been formed to look ahead to the next five years. Sales exceed \$10,000,000 annually.

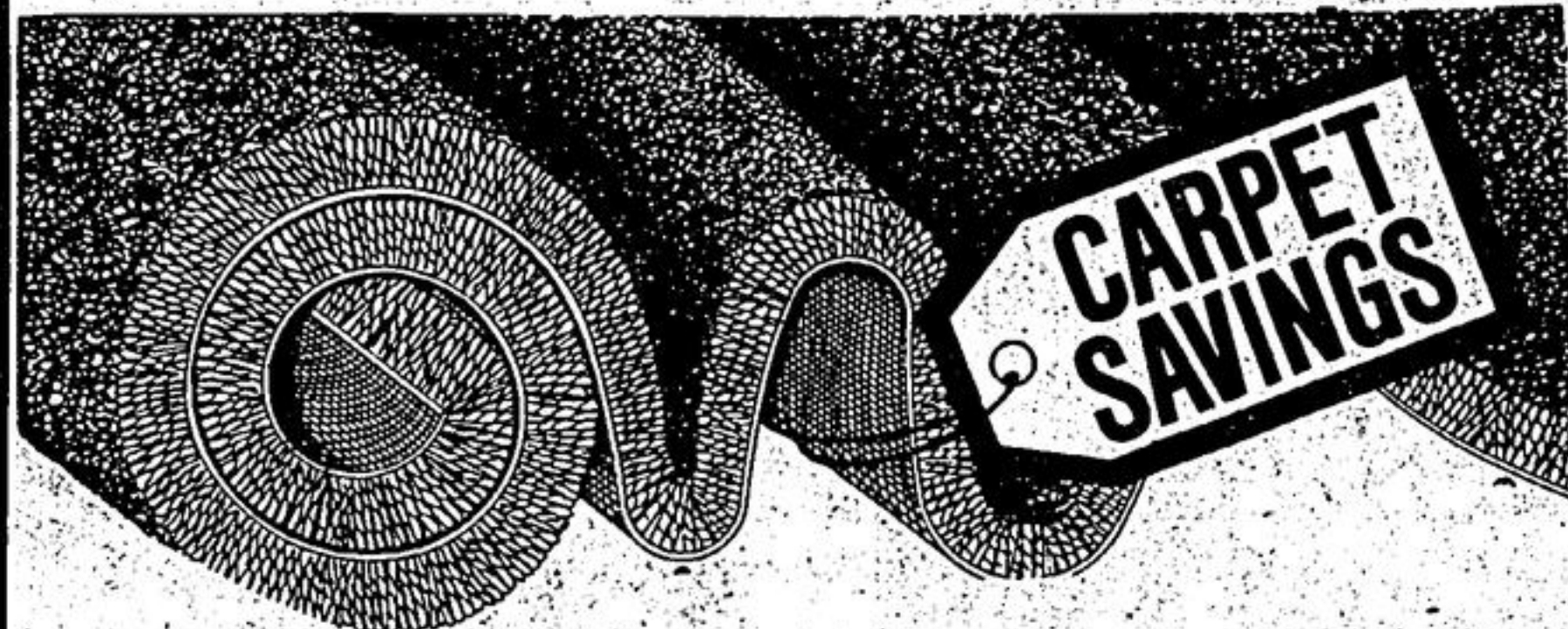
