STOUFFVILLE — The Ontario Provincial Womens Slowpitch championships will be played in Stouffville, this coming Saturday, September 13.

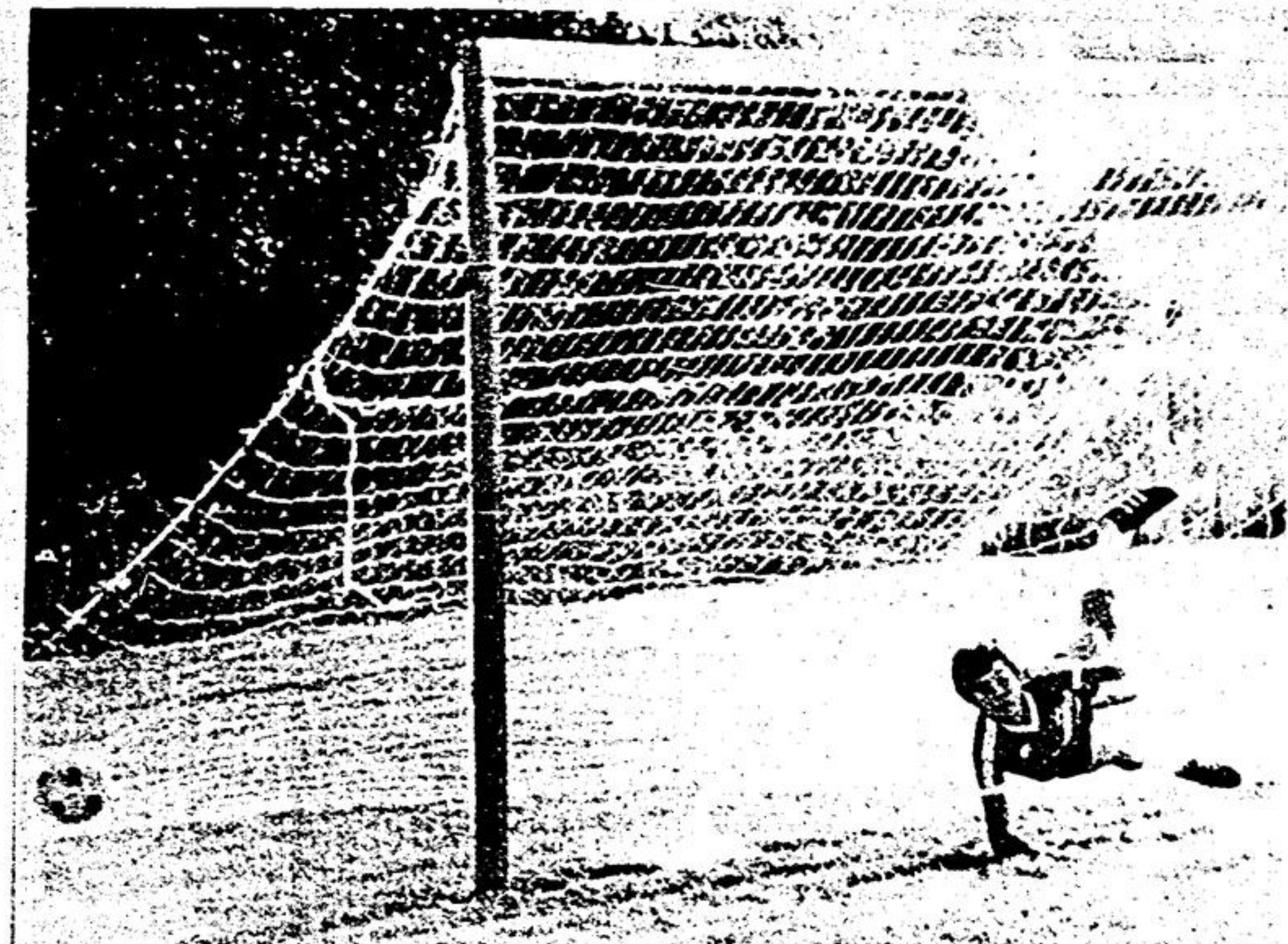
Teams from Windsor, London and Brantford

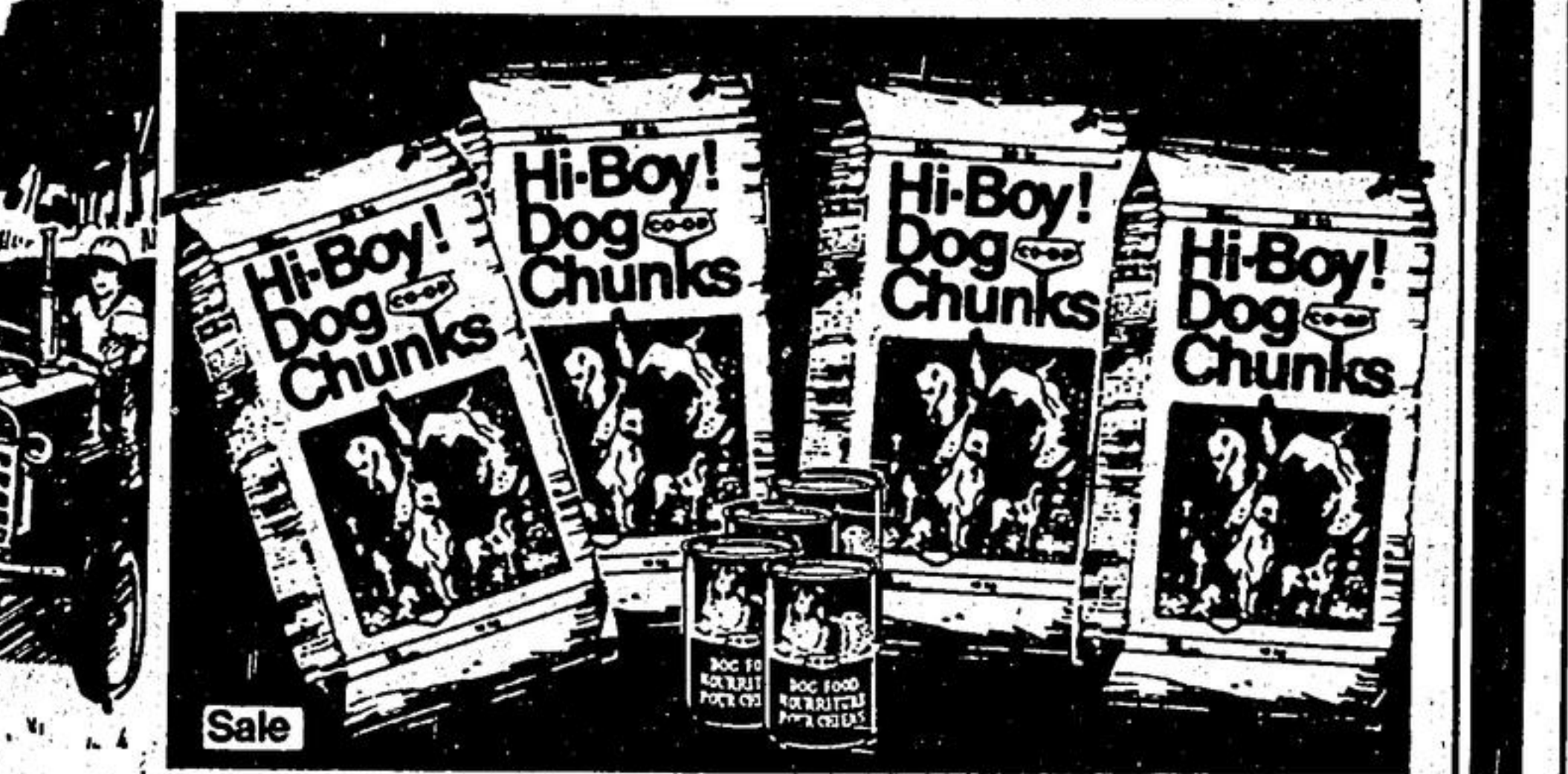
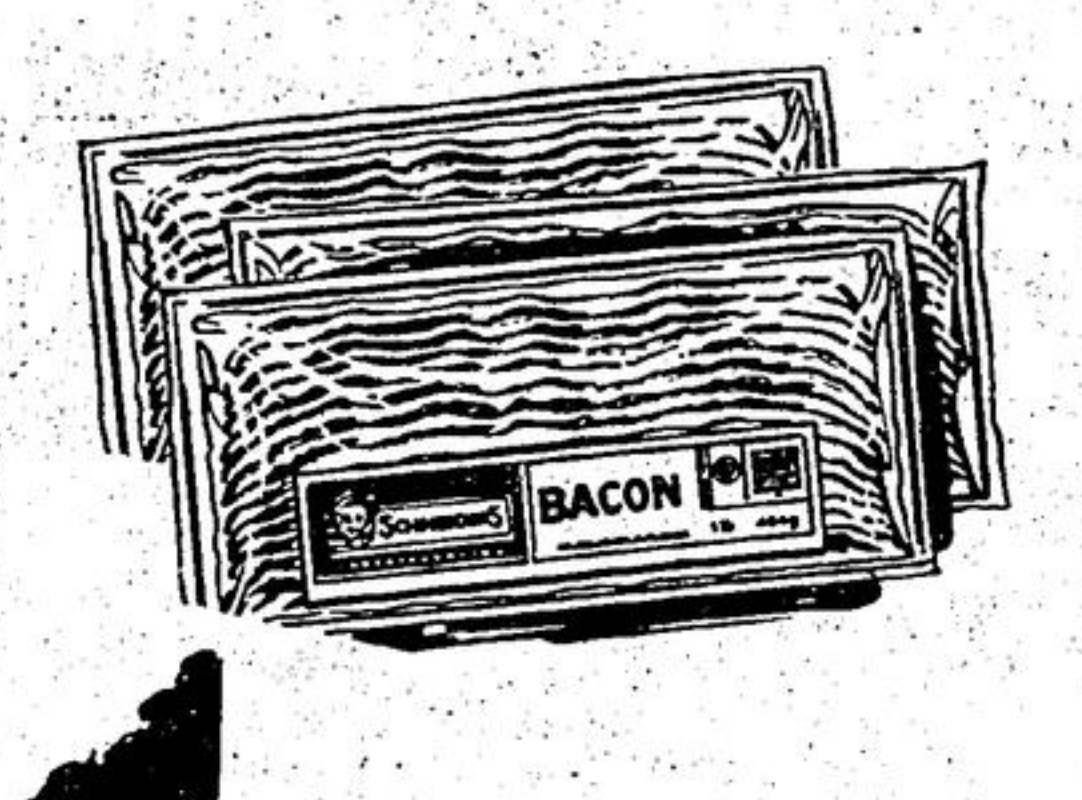
