Mr. Dave Armstrong, who has a Masters Degree in Business Administration will conduct the "Managing A Small Business" course.

The following are course outlines for the "geneology and creative drama classes"

Geneology non credit 10 weeks
This course is aimed at learning basic acting techniques through creative drama exercises. It concentrates on short projects for discussion among classmates rather than on large scale productions for outside audiences. Students will gain confidence gradually, since activities will progress from group projects to eventually working in pairs on the careful preparation of a script scene from a text.

Late in the year students may wish to invite a spouse or a friend to the classroom to see their work. No experience is necessary for this course. It is hoped that students will not only gain confidence and learn basic acting techniques but will enjoy a stimulating evening discovering an outlet for creative ideas they might not have realized they had.

Family History non credit 10 weeks
This course is an introduction to the study of family history in Canada. Where to begin finding out about your ancestors is often the hardest part of such a project. Class time will be spent on the basic research techniques, and methods of procedure. Also we shall examine types of materials available and where to find it. Just as important, some of the information, such as the Census returns will be explained in class to aid in understanding various terms, and the writing styles of the past. Canadian history and Victorian social customs will be examined as well, where they can aid in research.

People research family history for a variety of reasons, from finding out about where some particular ancestor was born, to an attempt to discover how their ancestors lived and worked. Whatever the purpose of your research, this course should serve as useful introduction.

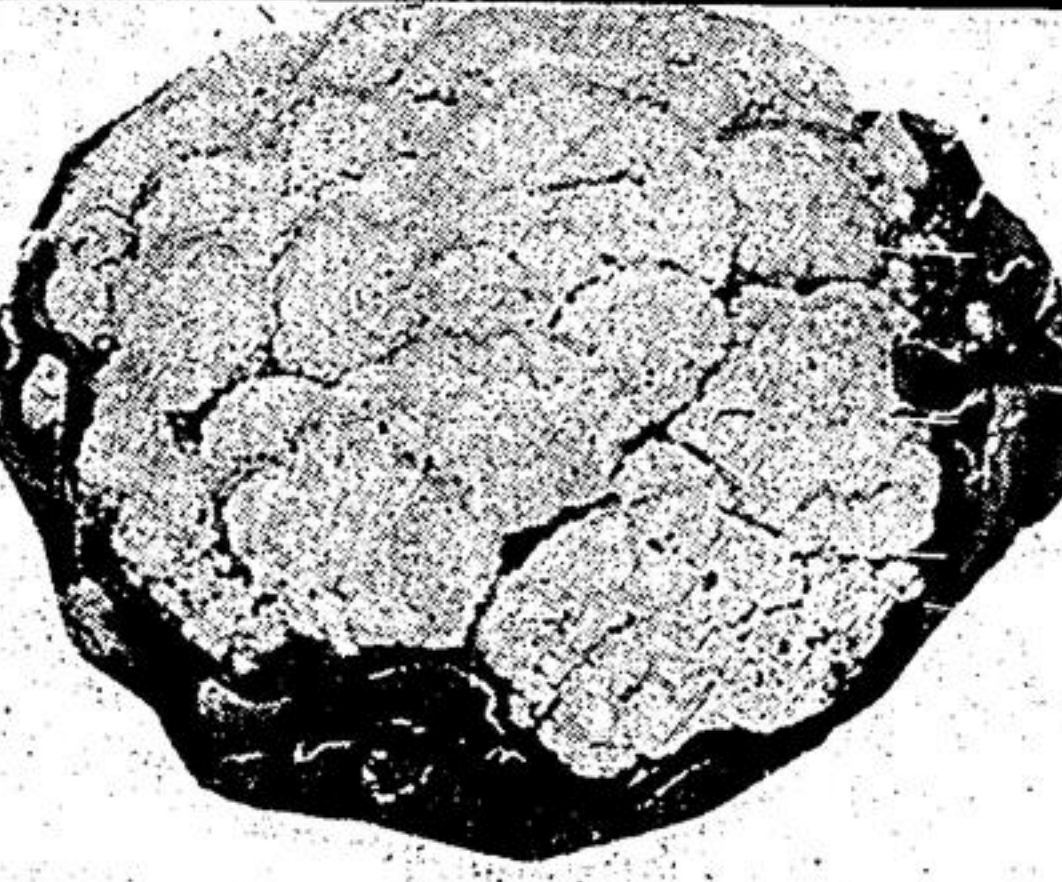

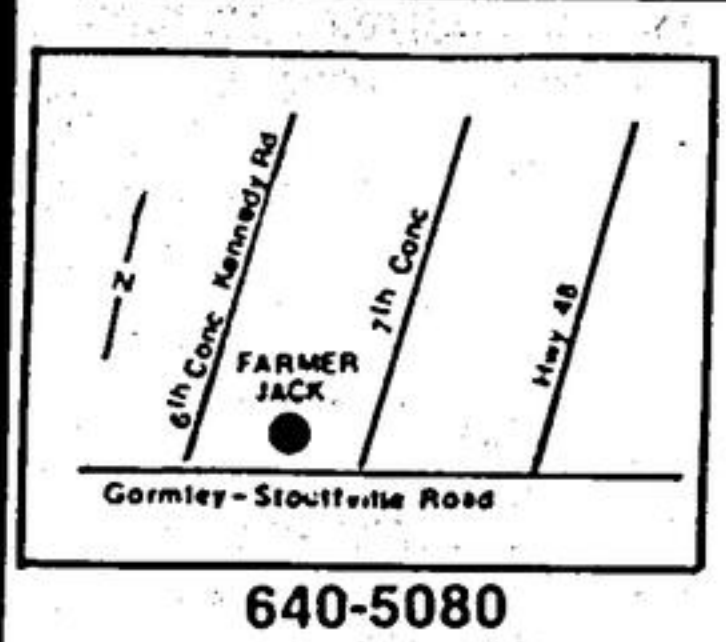
