# GOODWOOD CHAMPS

**GOODWOOD** — Commercial Sand and Gravel Peewees defeated Sebringville 15-3 in the third and deciding game of the All Ontario Peewee 'D' championship series on Saturday evening, to give Goodwood its first ever All Ontario Championship. The Goodwood batters connected early, opening with a seven run tally that had the Sebringville team at a distinct disadvantage for the rest of the game. They went on to score four more in the second, with the visitors replying with a three run tally of their own. The remainder of the Goodwood score came with one run in the third and the final three runs in the fifth.

Mike Knapp led the attack with four hits and some very aggressive base running, while Mark Murphy had three hits, including a line drive to the fence in the fifth innings. Other hits came from Marty Brown with three, Brian Kooje, Derek Clausen and Cam Todd two apiece, and Paul MacEwan and Steve May with one hit each.

Defensively, Goodwood pitcher, Derek Clausen kept the Sebringville batters off balance throughout the game, allowing only two hits and striking out twelve.

After the game, Vinny Walker, past-president of the O.A.S.A. presented Goodwood team captain Mark Murphy with the divisional plaque while manager Don Sturge accepted the champions banner on behalf of the team.

Following the presentations, the team were taken on the time honored traditional tour of the village by the Stouffville fire truck. With the sirens wailing and the boys chanting it was an exciting beginning for the celebrations to follow.

During the post-game celebrations, trophies for Most Improved Player were presented to pitchers Brian Kooje and Derek Clausen. Catcher Mike Knapp, who starred in so many of the team's victories, received the Most Valuable Player award. Best Sportsman award went to Shortstop Marty Brown.
