## Editor's Mail

Dear Editor: Recently, Stouffville's Ladies Intermediate Softball Team completed the most successful season in their history. The team, better known as the "Stouffville Merchants", became the "South Lake Simcoe Intermediate Ladies Softball Champions". As a first year member of the team, I would like to take this opportunity to comment on improvements necessary to make the 1981 season even more successful.

The major improvement required, in my opinion, is financial support. It is my understanding that in 1979, Stouffville's Chamber of Commerce was approached, and indicated it would be willing to sponsor the Intermediate Team — thus, we are called the "Stouffville Merchants". A more appropriate team name would be "Dunkeld's Devils", or something to that effect, as it was Head Coach Cliff Dunkeld who paid for the uniforms and equipment. Since that initial outlay of funds, updating and additions have been handled by players and coaches.

Another improvement deals with facilities. As coach of the Stouffville Girls' Bantam Team, I realize that this area probably affects most of Stouffville's teams. Coaches of both

teams mentioned above found it necessary to arrive at the park well in advance of the game in order to set-up and repair the diamond.

Coaches donated their time and expertise to COACH and should not have to act as grounds keepers. One incident that immediately comes to mind occurred during a Bantam Play-off game against Cobourg. It was necessary for two player's fathers to continue draining the infield. Their assistance allowed the coaches to return to the game which was already in progress. I believe that coaches' time could be better used motivating and developing players' skills than lining diamonds.

I have appreciated the opportunity to be associated with teams of which the Town of Whitchurch-Stouffville must be proud. On behalf of the Intermediate Ladies Softball Team I would like to thank the Stouffville Tribune for its continuing coverage; Lillian Cordell for making the Concession Booth available during games; our coaching staff: Cliff Dunkeld, Dave Stapleton, and Linda Stapleton for their undying dedication; and above all, our loyal spectators.
