## Ward Five Election "hot seat"

**STOUFFVILLE** — Ward 5 is the current "hot seat" on Whitechurch-Stouffville Council. To date, three candidates are definite: Marie Adams, Main Street West; Carol Best, Church Street North and Bill Morley, North Street. The only "unknown" is the incumbent, Councillor June Baston. A statement as to her intentions is expected soon.

"To grow or not to grow" would appear to be a main issue within the ward and a dividing line between the candidates. "We must grow," states Mrs. Adams. "If we stand still, we stagnate." She wants to see "a balance" that will accommodate the town's needs.

Mr. Morley, on the other hand, is not opposed to moderate growth, but doesn't see this as an immediate solution to local problems. He stresses industrial expansion. "We have the land but lack the services," he says. He also sees a need to mend the urban-rural split that, he feels, is apparent on Council. "I'll say what I think," he stated. "If the people don't want somebody like that, then they should support someone else."

Mrs. Baston takes the hard-line approach to residential development, saying they moved to Stouffville from German Mills because they liked the character of the town. "I want this quality of life to remain," she said. She voices opposition to the 500-home Dulverton Development proposed to the north claiming Council should make no concessions in order that this build-up can proceed. She sees a need for additional rental accommodation and more light industry. She also wants the Town to proceed with a master recreational plan.

Commencing Tuesday October 14, 1986, by agreement with the Town of Markham, the Toronto Transit Commission will provide transit service north of Steeles Avenue on Birchmount Avenue and looping at Denison Street by extending their Birchmount Route 17 service.
