Altona Mennonite Church Future indefinite

ALTONA — Altona Mennonite Church may be gone as a "meeting place," but it's far from forgotten.

Sunday afternoon, a large crowd returned to the little country chapel, closed since 1974, to recall both the pleasures and some of the pains of its long and enduring past. It is the hope of those supporting the service of "thanksgiving and remembrance," to renew sufficient interest in the building, which has been maintained in church-going order, to decide its fate as something other than just a local landmark.

"We want to see whether it should be preserved or moved," Joe Nighswander, chairman of the worship told The Tribune. He said it had long been used by the old order of Mennonites, but when the church became affiliated with the Mennonite Conference of Ontario in 1964, the services were divided among a circuit of three churches. With the exception of a few members, the congregation from Altona then attended the Mennonite Church on Steeles Avenue, on the Scarborough-Markham townline.

The building, Paul Burkholder, one of the speakers, told the congregation, was erected in 1852. Bricks were brought in from Cherrywood and pinewood from nearby. In 1857, the church property was formerly deeded to the Society of Mennonites, one of the stipulations being that the trustees were all to live within five miles of the site.

He said the last service held in the church was Sept. 15, 1974, when it was "abandoned as a regular meeting place." Aaron Grove, a former pastor, said he always felt badly when churches are no longer used. However, he believed every church, used or unused, has still a "speaking message to all."

He said the church was "a solid reminder" of the spiritual presence of those who once lived in the area.

He said he attended the church as a child, in all kinds of weather, sometimes running behind the sleigh to keep warm, only to arrive "and find it just as cold inside."

Mr. Grove said the services were always conducted in German, until his Uncle Levi managed to introduce some in English at Thanksgiving and on Good Friday.

"The people didn't like it much," he said, "but we kids did." Cecil Reesor, another "former participant," praised the beauty of the setting of the church and recalled the "simplicity of faith" of its adherents. Despite the latter, their rigid adherence to

farming and the land, "hindered us somewhat," Mr. Reesor said, "and kept us from becoming doctors," and following other professions.


He said he was "trying to be generous," but their "weaknesses and shortcomings" must be evaluated; their values must be embraced.

The message, "Let us arise and go back to Bethel," was delivered by

Rev. Paul Martin.

He said that "life for all is a pilgrim age," with God opening doors and providing opportunities which people didn't always see.

Harvey Nighswander said it was "wonderful to have lovely things," but not everything is lasted. "We have to use these experiences to God's doing ... 'I believe there are greater things ahead'," he said.

Christian School A deficit in first year

STOUFFVILLE — A first year deficit of \$42,000 is anticipated should a Christian school be established in this community.

This "bottom line" figure is contained in a budget prepared recently for presentation to the congregation of Stouffville Missionary Church.

Receipts and expenditures were based on an enrollment of 40 students. The anticipated tuition fee (first year) is estimated at \$1,200 per student.

Initial capital costs, including a \$6,000 portable classroom, are placed at \$17,360. Added to this are on-going annual costs including one principal-teacher, \$26,000; other teachers, \$45,000; a secretary, \$9,000 and a custodian, \$5,000.


This raises the total cost (first year) to \$107,360.

The income from tuition fees will amount to \$48,000 which, subtracted from the annual on-going expense, including \$5,000 worth of supplies, leaves a deficit of \$42,000.

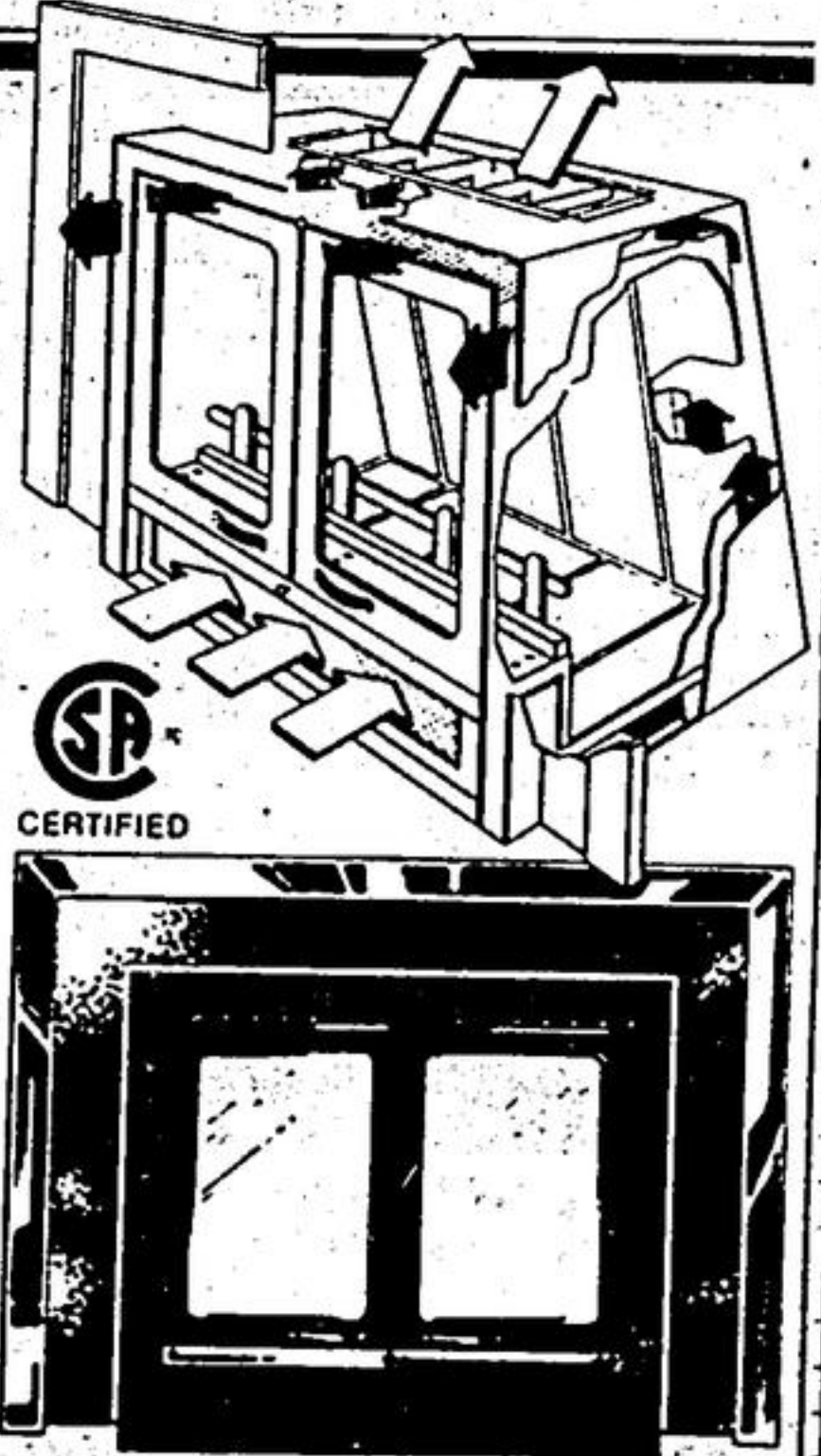


