

Clippers win two

STOUFFVILLE — A pair of wins by the Anderson Haulage Clippers has set the mood for the coming season.

According to coach Wayne Emmerson, the team has "powerful potential" and the most difficult task he will face this season is making the cut. "The Clippers have a lot of talent this year," he said.

Win number won came in an exhibition game against Schomberg Cougars last Thursday. The Cougars opened the

scoring within the first two minutes of play, with Clippers' Norm McKenzie getting the tie on Ian Johnson's assist at the six minute mark. Lorne Potter took the assist from Kelly Burrows for the Clippers second goal, ending the period 3-2 to the Cougars.

The Clippers forged ahead in the second period with Potter picking up his second goal of the game, on Burrows assist, for a 3-3 tie. Luke Gauthier and Mark Fockler added two more

goals while Zenon Byblow doubled the Clipper tally for a 6-3 lead at the end of the second.

The Clippers scored again in the opening minutes of the third period with a goal by Gary Curtis. The Cougars replied with two very quick goals, all within eleven seconds, before the Clippers put the game out of sight, with goals by Byblow from Ted Waite and an unassisted effort by Joe Twinney.

A last minute goal by Schomberg ended the game 9-5.

In their return game on Saturday evening, at Stouffville, the Schomberg Cougars were thoroughly humiliated, this time 10-4.

Despite an early goal by Ted Waite the Cougars lead the first period 2-1.

With most of the Cougars sitting in the penalty box throughout the second period, the Clippers made the most of the opportunity offered and amassed no less than five unanswered goals for an 8-2 lead at the end of the period.

The teams matched goals in the third period, with Clippers goals coming from Luc Gauthier and Ian Johnson with assists going to Doug Blizard and Lorne Potter.

The Clippers open regular season play this Saturday against Lindsay, at Stouffville arena. Face-off is at 7:30 p.m.

NOTICE OF APPLICATION FOR APPROVAL

TO EXPROPRIATE LAND

IN THE MATTER OF an application by The Regional Municipality of York for approval to expropriate land described in Schedule "A", hereto annexed in the Town of Whitchurch-Stouffville in The Regional Municipality of York for or in connection with:

The widening and reconstruction of Regional Road No. 69 (Ninth Line) in the Town of Whitchurch-Stouffville from Regional Road No. 40 (Bloomington Road) to a point approximately 500 feet north of Lakeshore Road to a basic width of 100 feet with additional widening at cuts, fills and its intersection with Regional Road No. 40 (Bloomington Road).

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that application has been made for approval to expropriate the lands described in Schedule "A", hereto. Any owner of land in respect of which notice is given who desires an inquiry into whether the taking of such land is fair, sound and reasonably necessary in the achievement of the objectives of the expropriating authority shall so notify the approving authority in writing.

(a) in the case of a registered owner served personally or by registered mail, within thirty days after he is served with the notice, or, when he is served by publication, within thirty days after the first publication of the notice;

(b) in the case of an owner who is not a registered owner, within thirty days after the first publication of the notice.

NOTES:

1. The Expropriations Act provides that, (a) Where an inquiry is requested, it shall be conducted by an inquiry officer, appointed by the Minister of Justice and Attorney General;

(b) The inquiry officer, (i) shall give every party to the inquiry an opportunity to present evidence and argument and to examine and cross-examine witnesses, either personally or by his counsel or agent, and

(ii) may recommend to the approving authority that a party to the inquiry be paid a fixed amount for his costs of the inquiry not to exceed \$200 and the approving authority may in its discretion, order the expropriating authority to pay such costs forthwith.

2. "owner" and "registered owner" are defined in the Act as follows;

"owner" includes a mortgagee, tenant, execution creditor, a person entitled to a limited estate or interest in land, a committee of the estate of a mentally incompetent person or a person incapable of managing his affairs, and a guardian, executor, administrator or trustee in whom land is vested;

"registered owner" means an owner of land whose interest in the land is defined and whose name is specified in an instrument in the proper registry, land titles or sheriff's office, and includes a person shown as a tenant of land on the last revised assessment roll.

3. The expropriating authority, each owner who notifies the approving authority that he desires a hearing in respect of the lands intended to be expropriated and any owner added as a party by the inquiry officer are parties to the inquiry.
