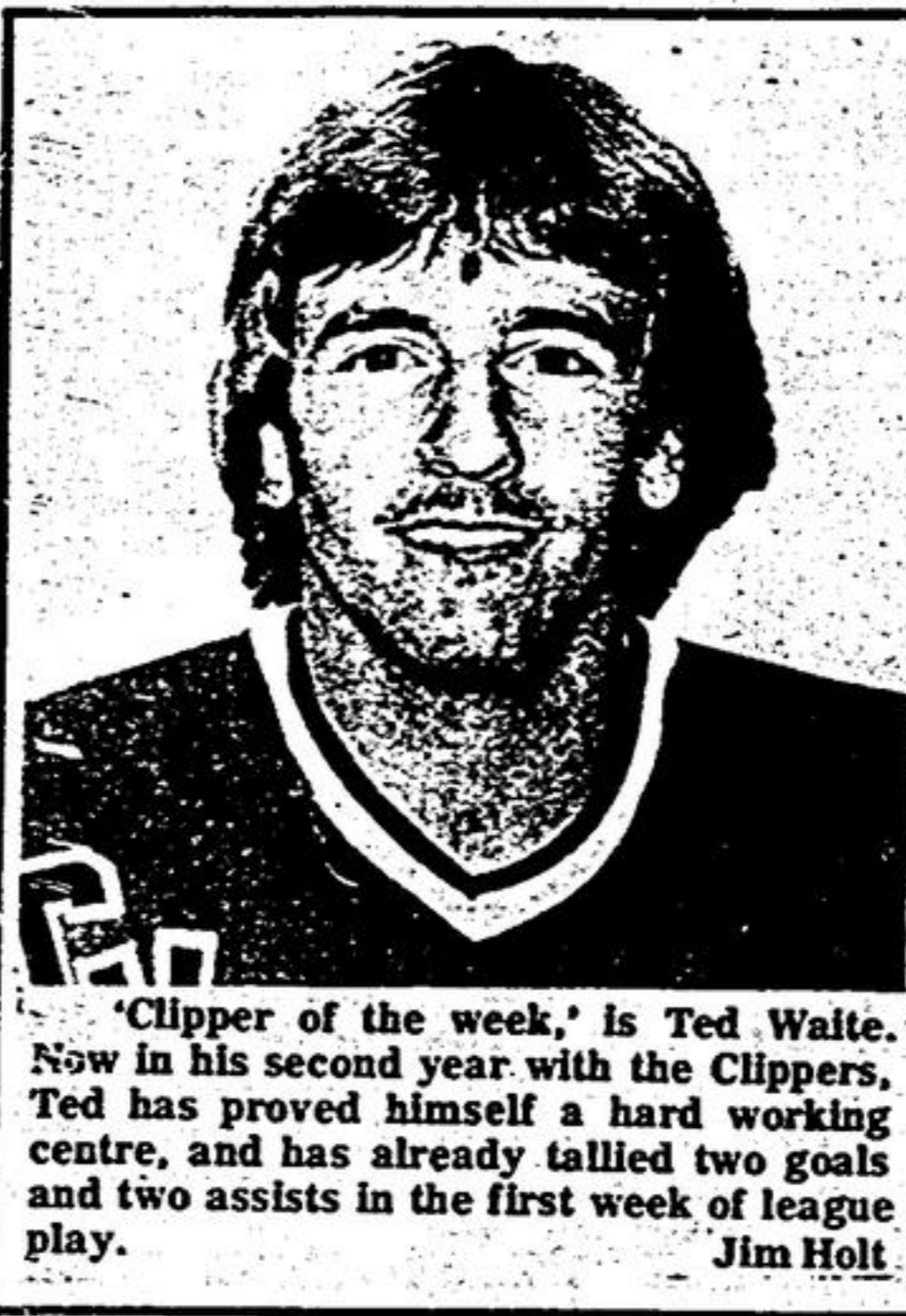

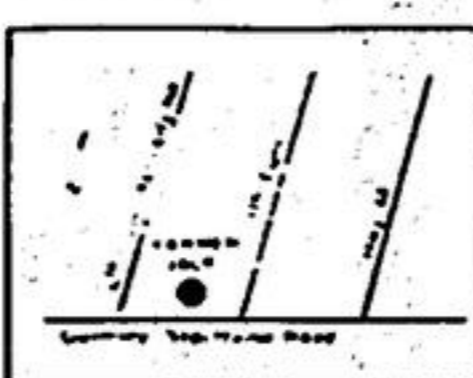

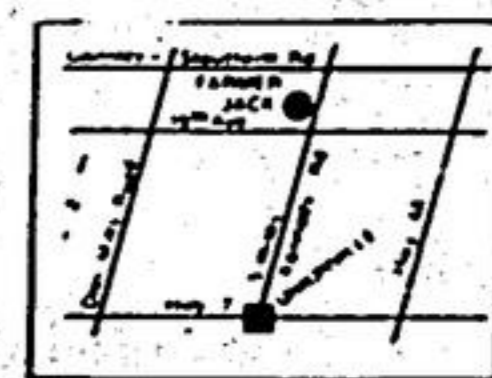

- shall state the name and address of the candidate in such a manner as will identify him and the officer for which he is nominated; and
- shall state the name and address of each elector signing the nomination paper and where the office for which the candidate is nominated is a member of a school board, that such nominator is a public school elector or a separate school elector, as the fact is; and

Take notice that the nomination paper shall state for which office and in which ward, except for those running at large, the candidate is proposing to be nominated. And further take notice that where the candidate is running in a ward his nomination paper must be signed by people on the List of Electors in that specific ward.

And further take notice that onus is on the person nominated for election to an office to file a bona fide nomination paper.
