Ballantrae Lions Club proud of mobile canteen

By Jim Irving BALLANTRAE — Not all that long ago, Ballantrae Lions Club bought a mobile canteen unit for \$150. Today, if you wanted to buy it from them, it would probably cost you something like \$14,000.

That's the price their Aurora counterparts paid for their new trailer, but, then perhaps their membership wasn't so diversified as Ballantrae's.

"We've got every kind of occupation here," says president Herb Peach. "If it's plumbing, you need, we've got a plumber; contractor - we've got contractors."

There are also office managers, propane distributors, farmers, such as Herb (he's an electrical contractor,

too), and various others, so that remodeling, painting and installing various appliances to something such as the mobile canteen, isn't the impossible theme it might seem at the outset.

All told, the trailer cost them \$3,500 when it was revamped, which is about as good an illustration as any of one of the meanings of "service" in service club.

The unit, incidentally, was used by the club for the first time on Canada Day, when it fired off pancakes from both sides. It's also been used to dispense hot chili, and was all set for the recent Markham Fair. Unfortunately, like a local politician, it just missed the deadline.

However, when it comes to deadlines, Ballantrae Lions are

more in the habit of meeting than missing them. And, many of those deadlines are the ones they set, themselves. That usually means a short period to meet a quick goal.

And goals are very definitely a major part of the club's agenda. In fact, one wonders if the president's list is ever going to end, as he reels off some of the year's projects.

Among these - and they all raise funds for various community services performed by the club - are the annual August steer roast; a cabaret, Nov. 13 and 14, also becoming an annual affair; the spring fertilizer sale; the May garage sale; summer bingo at Cedar Beach, dances, turkey shoots and ham rolls.

There's also a draw that runs throughout the year, with participants paying \$10 a month, and standing the chance of visiting some of the more exotic spots of the world.

However, just as soon as the money rolls in, it goes out just as fast to everything from the Ballantrae Tennis Club for a wind protector, to the area senior citizens for trips and a portable school.

Just to show it's not afraid to spread its wings a bit, Ballantrae's even participating in the Stouffville Kinsmen Club's Christmas parade.

With the 35-member club since its origination three years ago, Peach talks enthusiastically about its progress and its plans. However, he also hints at more moderation as the 80's move to their

expensive conclusion. Where most clubs still dine on the standard fare at their meetings, some are now resorting to coffee and donuts, Peach says.

"Internationally, they're a bit concerned about the future," he adds.

That's internationally. Right now, people of Ballantrae and district who rely on the club, both for some of their benefits and amusements, would seem to be in good hands for a long time to come.

Garbage dump

MUSS. LAKE — Residents of the Lake looking for a community project, don't have to search any farther than an isolated area on Hillsdale Drive, between Concessions 9 and 10.

The latter, a small lane on private property, for some years now, has served as a garbage dump for persons unknown, and it looks as if there won't be any let up.

"We've cleaned it up a number of times," says Bruce Arrowsmith, chief building officer for Whitechurch - Stouffville. "We've made checks, but we can't have someone out there all day long."

He said assistance had been requested from York Regional Police for more checks, "but they haven't been much help."

Arrowsmith said the town had erected warning signs at the spot, as well, but they had had little effect.

"If some local residents would lend a hand, it would sure help," he said.

He said there were no dwellings within half a mile of the land, which had several owners.

Arrowsmith said the town by-law called for a maximum fine of \$1,000 for anyone convicted of dumping there.

Advance Poll

The Advance Poll for each ward will be held on Saturday, November 1, 1980 between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 8:00 p.m. in the Municipal Offices, 1710 Kingston Road.

Voting Day

Monday, November 10, 1980 is polling day and the polls will be open from 11:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m.

Notification of Voters

Cards will be sent by mail to all the electors shown on the Preliminary List of Electors. This card will indicate where the electors can vote at the Advance Poll or on November 10, 1980. Subject to acclamations, the electors will be voting for candidates for the following offices:

Town of Pickering

Mayor - to be elected at large
One Councillor - to serve on both the Regional and Town Councils to be elected from each of Wards 1, 2 and 3
One Councillor - to serve on the Town Council only to be elected from each of Wards 1, 2 and 3

Board of Education

One Trustee - to be elected from each of Wards 1, 2 and 3 by Public School Supporters only
One Trustee - to be elected at large by Separate School Supporters only

Durham Roman Catholic Separate School Board

Three Trustees - to be elected at large by Separate School Supporters only

Qualification of Electors

Any person is qualified to be an elector in the Town of Pickering if, between the period of September 2, 1980 to October 22, 1980, he:

- is a resident in the Town or is the owner or tenant of land in the Town or the spouse of such an owner or tenant;
 - is a Canadian citizen or other British subject;
 - has attained the age of eighteen years or will be eighteen years of age on or before polling day.
- If your name is not included in the List of Electors, you should follow one of the following procedures:
- attend at the office of the Clerk during the period of revision to the Preliminary List of Electors before October 22, 1980 and request that your name be added to the List;
 - attend at the office of the Clerk on or before November 10, 1980 and request a Clerk's Certificate to vote;
 - attend at your polling place on November 10, 1980 and request your Deputy Returning Officer to issue you a D.R.O.'s Certificate to vote.

Proxy Vote

Forms are available at the office of the Clerk for the appointment of a voting proxy. A certificate to vote by proxy must be certified by the Clerk between October 21, 1980 and November 10, 1980 at 5:00 p.m.
