Qualification of Electors

Any person is qualified to be an elector in the Town of Pickering if, between the period of September 2, 1980 to October 22, 1980, he:

(a) is a resident in the Town or is the owner or tenant of land in the Town or the spouse of such an owner or tenant; (b) is a Canadian citizen or other British subject;

(c) has attained the age of eighteen years or will be eighteen years of age on or before polling day.

If your name is not included in the List of Electors, you should follow one of the following procedures:

(a) attend at the office of the Clerk during the period of revision to the Preliminary List of Electors before October 22, 1980 and request that your name be added to the List;

(b) attend at the office of the Clerk on or before November 10, 1980

and request a Clerk's Certificate to vote;

(c) attend at your polling place on November 10, 1980 and request your Deputy Returning Officer to issue you a D.R.O.'s Certificate

Forms are available at the office of the Clerk for the appointment of a voting proxy. A certificate to vote by proxy must be certified by the Clerk between October 21, 1980 and November 10, 1980 at 5:00 p.m.
