# End winning streak

**STOUFFVILLE** — Saturday night's game at the Stouffville arena between Uxbridge and the Anderson Haulage Clippers proved a point. The Clippers can play as badly as anyone in the league — given half a chance.

Something of a letdown for Clipper fans. Having won eight games straight they have become accustomed to their team winning on every occasion, but, to be fair, there were extenuating circumstances.

Prior to the game, coach Wayne Emmerson confided that his team was 'hurting badly'. Price and Rugelis should not even have been on the ice. Price has an injured shoulder, and Rugelis a wrenched ankle. Unfortunately, the Clippers were also missing four players: Byblow, Bartley, Gierkink and Fockler, all under a two game suspension for last week's fracas at Little Britain. Chivers was also missing from the defence line. It was enough to turn a hockey coach grey.

The Clippers started well enough. MacKenzie

was in great form, scoring two of his three goals within ten minutes of play. Both assists came from Ian Johnson who paced MacKenzie well.

Killing a powerplay in the closing minutes, the period ended with a comfortable 2-0 lead for the Clippers.

Uxbridge coach Chuck Phillips must have said some magic words in the break, because the Bruins came on strong in the second period with three goals in the first nine minutes and went ahead 4-3 with just over a minute left to play.

Fockler's goal, from Ted Waite, early in the period kept the Clippers in the game.

Both penalty boxes saw lots of comings and goings in the final period. Stouffville killed two power-plays by the Bruins but could not stop

them from potting two more goals before MacKenzie, from Dix, on a power-play, tallied the Clippers final goal in the last five minutes.

The final 6-5 win to Uxbridge hardly reflected the strength of their new season's team — rather the current weakness of the Clippers; a lack of players on the night. Still, the fans deserved a better quality game, if only for coming out to support their teams in such terrible weather.

With two games in hand the Clippers now stand second in the league. Next week's schedule is as follows: Saturday Nov. 1, at home against Bewdley. The following day, Sunday, they play away at Port Perry, and on Monday are at Cobourg. All games start at 7:30 p.m.
