York Region companies lead individual groups with \$52,785 donated. Employee groups have given \$24,529 and local residents have contributed \$23,636.

A major push to increase donations from York residents will begin the last week in October with the distribution of a mailing to all households.

Bob Higgs, United Way executive director, says the 19 agencies funded by the campaign are counting on -a good to the response mailing. Residents will be able to return a portion of the mailing with their donation.

The United Way of York Region funds 19 agencies including the Stouffville Family Life Centres, and Helpmate Information and Referral Services.

Helpmate okayed

STOUFFVILLE - A program designed to provide alternatives to jail through community service, has been given hearty endorsement by Whitchurch - Stouffville Council.

Council was advised of the program in a letter from Helpmate Information, Richmond Hill. It said that Community Service Order (CSO) was one of several programs, wherein a judge ordered a convicted person to perform a number of volunteer hours in the community as a condition of his or her probation order.

Candidates are carefully screened before being recommended to a judge. He then decides if they are suitable and how many hours to assess them, the letter said.

Once the judge has given an order, CSO must place the offender. This is done through community agencies, the letter said.

In moving support, Councillor Bill Kamps termed it "an excellent program. It may solve some of the vandalism in the park, if we can get the people who caused it to repair it."
