Addition to bazaar

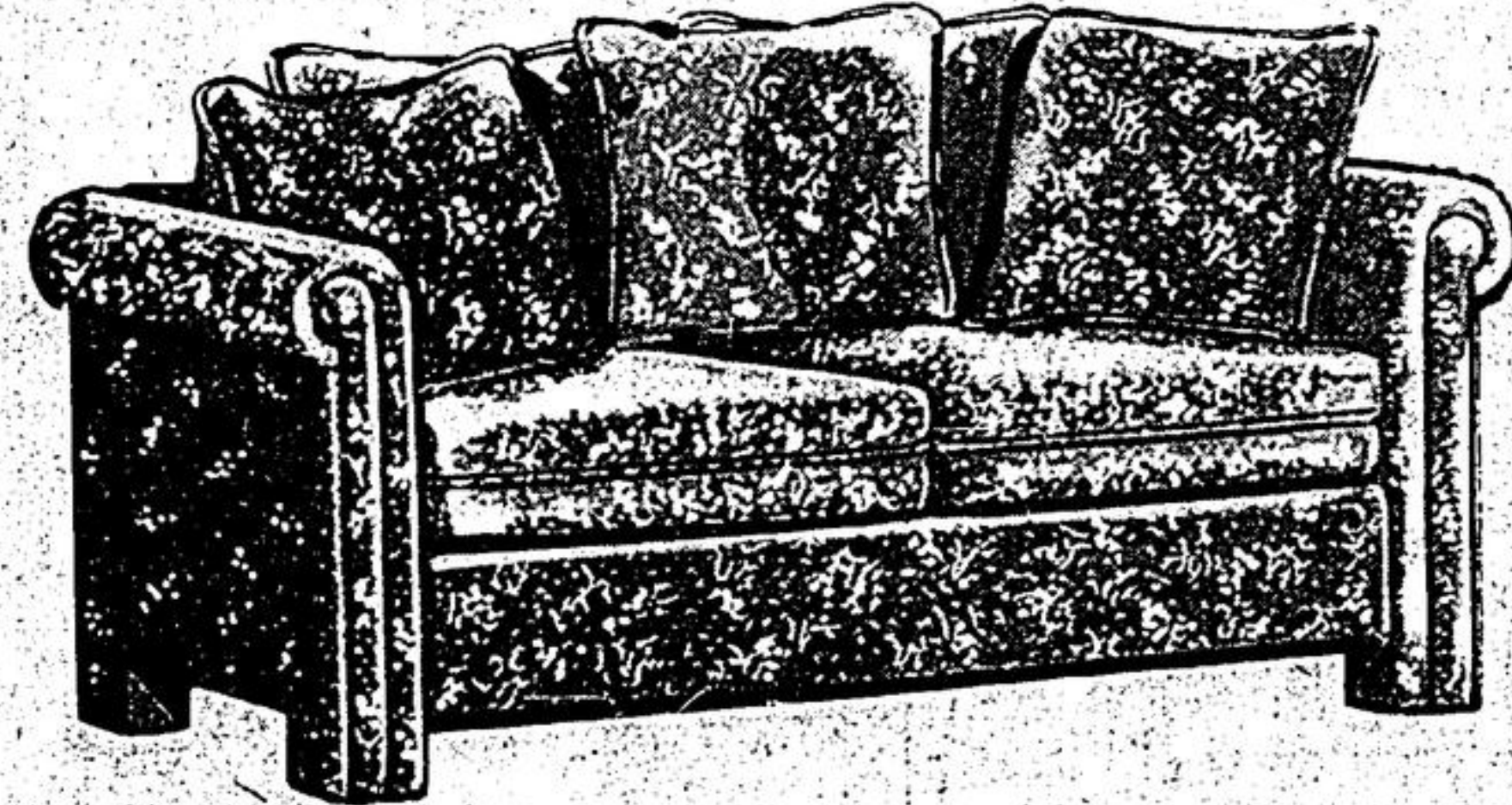
