She said she took two containers of cheese from the shelf at a supermarket on Bayview Avenue but only paid for one because the price had doubled.

The angry customer explained further that on a recent trip out West, she had witnessed farmers dumping their milk because they couldn't get a fair price for it. Judge White in-

formed the accused that ordinarily, such an offense brings a fine of \$25. "However, because the price of cheese has doubled, I'll let you off
