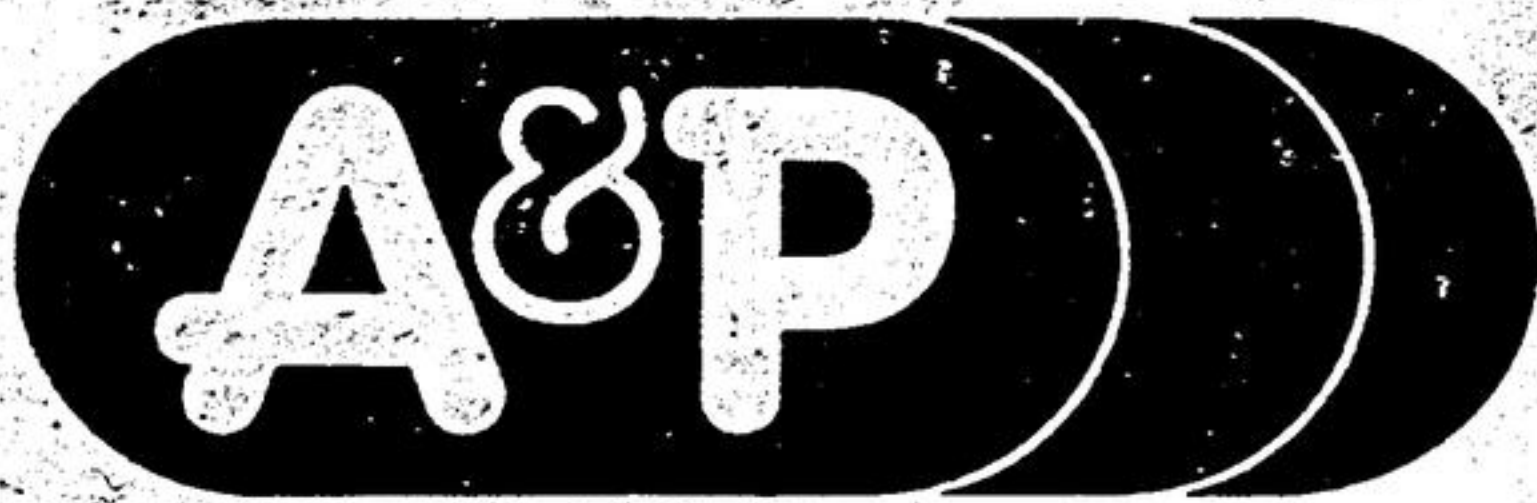

Priest on trial

MARKHAM - A Catholic priest, charged on fifty counts of fraud, has been committed for trial in County Court, Newmarket. The decision followed a preliminary hearing before Judge J.C. Horwitz.

Plus Finnin will be tried by judge and jury. The trial date will be set Dec. 1.

Finnin, 57, was earlier charged by York Regional Police following an intensive investigation by Detectives Barry Delaney and Robert McCausland.

Charges against the accused man's brother have been withdrawn.

Detective Delaney said the R.C.M.P. in Winnipeg had laid further charges against the priest with others pending in Alberta and New Brunswick.

Fine reduced

YORK REGION - The rising cost of a particular food product, led to the court appearance of a housewife, last week.

Charged with being in possession of a carton of cottage cheese, the woman entered a plea of guilty before Judge F.D. White. However, she said she had a reason.

She said she took two containers of cheese from the shelf at a supermarket on Bayview Avenue but only paid for one because the price had doubled.

The angry customer explained further that on a recent trip out West, she had witnessed farmers dumping their milk because they couldn't get a fair price for it.

Judge White informed the accused that ordinarily, such an offense brings a fine of \$25. "However, because the price of cheese has doubled, I'll let you off with \$12.50."
