Canvass Region by mail

YORK REGION — The distribution of over 75,000 mailers asking York Region residents for a donation will mark the conclusion of this year's United Way campaign.

The mailing, which is replacing the traditional door-to-door canvassing this year, is being sent to each household and includes a self-addressed, postage paid, return envelope.

"It's a new approach for us but mailings in other Canadian communities have been highly successful for years. Last year, the United Way of Greater Victoria had a tremendous response. Over 100,000 pieces were mailed and within two-and-a-half months nearly 6,000 donations were returned. The average contribution was \$22.00.
