The contribution, moved by Councillor Bill Kamps and seconded by Councillor Becky Wedley, was approved at a year-end meeting, Nov. 25. Mayor Eldred King requested that either the Administrator or the Clerk make sure the money is properly channelled so that it reaches the intended source. At the same meeting, members were told that an anonymous donor had sent in a cheque for \$3,000 to help subsidize the Midget hockey team's trip to Sweden later this month.

Canadians fortunate

STOUFFVILLE — The Tribune publisher C.H. Nolan, an annual visitor to Britain, reports that the stories of horrendous prices in the Old Country are all too true. Any idea that rising gas prices will curtail highway traffic is false. Gas for your car will cost you exactly three times what it does at local pumps but roads are as clogged with traffic as ever. Grocery prices are on average one and a half to two and a half times higher than in Canada. Restaurant prices, while they can vary greatly, are close to double local prices. Real Estate figures are in the unbelievable bracket and can vary from area to area, but the price of \$100,000 for a small two-bedroom house would not be uncommon. A loan at the bank can cost you 17 to 18 per cent and your non-checking account will bring you 14 per cent interest. Having told of all these astronomical prices it was interesting to find that the Old Age Pension is \$100 more than in Canada.
