Harry Bowes

'Work together'

NEWMARKET — The school board "should not take the place of parents, families, churches and other social service agencies, but should share a combined effort with these," Harry Bowes of Stouffville, newly-elected chairman of York County Board of Trustees, told the board's inaugural meeting, Monday.

Bowes was the unanimous choice of the board to succeed retiring chairman, Dorothy Zajac, of King. Another unanimous choice, was separate school trustee, Michael Neill, Thornhill, who was named vice-chairman.

Bowes said he was "convinced that we have one of the best educational systems in the province," and he hoped the people would be convinced as well.

However, he said he felt everyone should consider such things as: whether the family life education program was serving the needs of the students, and was it acceptable to the majority of parents? Were the board's special education programs meeting the needs of exceptional children? Were the board's internal and external communications adequate? Was it aware of the continual technological and sociological changes? Where was its morals and ethics program?

"We must communicate to the public that we are competent in these areas, and that portables, busing and grade eight in the high schools are a necessity at this stage..." Bowes said. The public must know about the board's "excellent curricula," "superior evaluation procedures," and its efforts to get "a more equitable way than property tax for educational financing..."

Bowes said he hoped the board's "new committee structure will be adopted. I believe this will streamline procedure and save both trustee and staff time..." he said. Although not elaborating, he said the system would "be more open and responsive to the public, who could have more input at committee level and not be restricted to the mandatory 15-minute delegation at board meetings."

One of the board's "initial tasks" would be in setting the 1981 budget. He said it "must practise restraint in a responsible fashion."

Bowes thanked the board for its confidence in electing him, and in turn was paid tribute to by veteran Newmarket Trustee, Craig Cribar. Cribar said that no one was more qualified for the job.

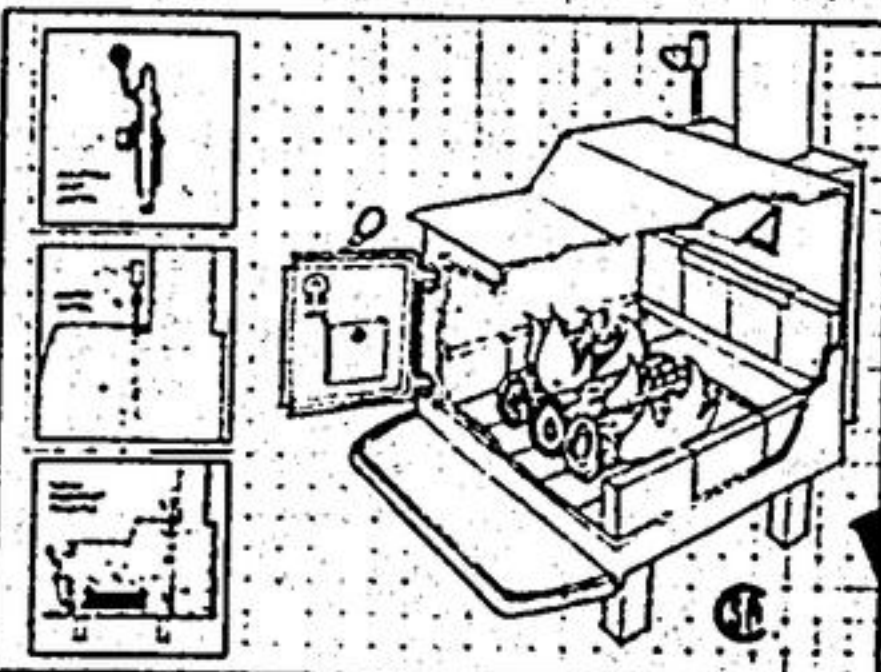
