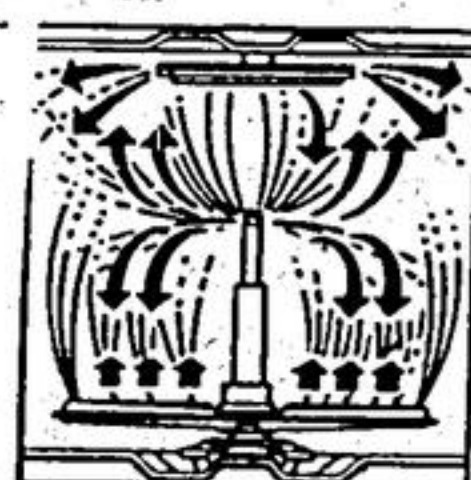

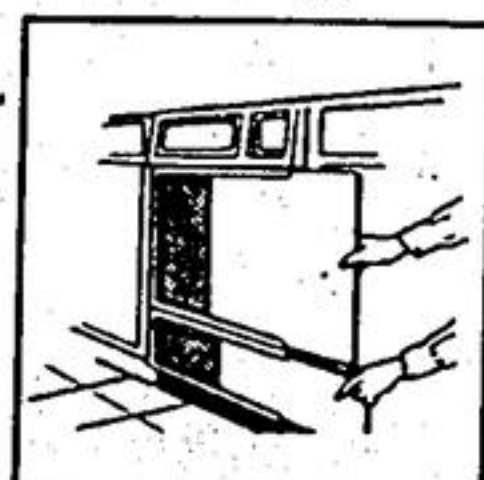

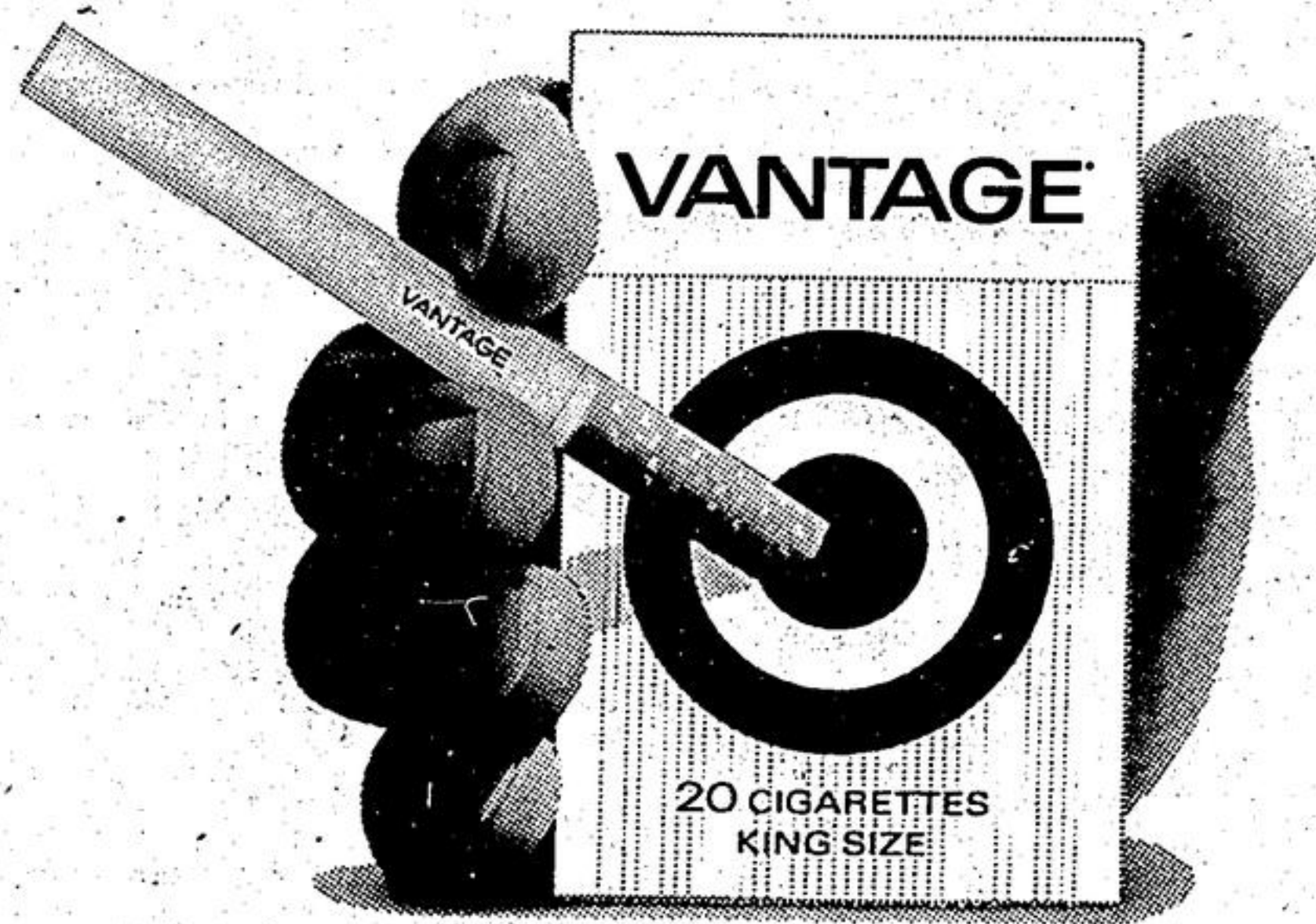


Multi-level wash action directs surging jets of hot water over dishes from above and below both racks to give the most thorough wash possible.
