

Dr. Glen Kennedy

Hockey-his life



Dr. Glen Kennedy, hockey leader in the Markham-Unionville area for thirty years, died suddenly, Dec. 9 while attending a Jr. "A" game in Hamilton.

UNIONVILLE — For Dr. Glen Kennedy, the arena was his "second home". And if death was to come, it seemed only right that it should occur at this location—during a hockey game, the sport he loved so much.

"Doc" Kennedy was as much a part of local hockey rinks as the players themselves. He had literally grown up in this environment, with an association in O.H.A. Jr. "B" competition that extended back thirty years. At the time of his passing, he was a co-owner of the Markham "Waxers" in O.H.A. Provincial Jr. "A".

Aside from a few stints in goal, Glen's hockey involvement was mainly in an executive capacity. But he didn't

work behind the scenes; he was always prominent in the stands, the sports most enthusiastic spectator.

Glen had a knack for selling tickets. His persistence raised thousands of dollars, all for hockey.

His passing occurred suddenly, Dec. 9 at Hamilton. He was stricken during the overtime period of a hockey game between Markham and Hamilton and was pronounced dead on arrival at hospital. He was 55.

Born at Unionville, the son of Dr. and Mrs. A.C. Kennedy, Glen grew up in the village. He attended Markham High School and later, Albert College, Belleville and Pickering College, Newmarket. He

graduated from the Toronto Chiropractic College in 1949.

Prior to the opening of a new chiropractic clinic on Kennedy Road, south of Unionville, he worked with his father and brother, Dr. Keith Kennedy, out of their private residence. The clinic was constructed in 1957.

While hockey was the No. 1 sport in his life, Glen enjoyed other forms of recreation also. He always attended a number of Toronto Blue Jay games during the summer.

Hundreds visited the Dixon-Garland Funeral Home in Markham prior to the service, Saturday, in Central United Church, Unionville. The floral tributes were beautiful.

The entire Markham team paid their respects and on Friday, each player wore a black arm band, honoring the club's co-owner. A minute's silence was observed.

Besides his wife, the former Norma Neal; his parents and brother Keith, he is survived by two daughters, Cathy (Mrs. Jacques Brisebois), Lefavre, Ont., Debbie of Osnburgh House, Ont., two sons, Peter, a student at Waterloo University and David at home; and two sisters, Fern (Mrs. Colin Macdonald) and June (Mrs. Clifford Labbett), both of Toronto. He was predeceased by a brother Chris.

Interment was made at Bethesda Lutheran Cemetery, Unionville.
