

Clippers clobber Cobourg

STOUFFVILLE — Having dropped an 8-7 decision at Lindsay on Friday evening the Anderson Haulage Clippers got their act together in their home game against Cobourg on Saturday night. They delighted the fans by dominating the game for an 11-5 win. Inspired goaltending by Dean Howse, and a three goal scoring spree by Bruce Rugelis helped the Clippers lower the

boom on the league front runners. First shot from the Clippers 11 goal broadside was fired by Mark Fockler, followed five minutes later by Ken Dix; both on assists from Zenon Byblow. For Cobourg the second period was a nightmare. Nothing they could do could stop the Clippers from scoring.

Whatever confidence they possessed was blasted away in a six goal salvo opened by Ken Dix (from Mark Fockler) five minutes into the period, and followed quickly by Kevin Bartley (from Joe Twinney), Gary Curtis (from Dave Greenaway) and two goals in quick succession from Rugelis (from Twinney and Steve Price). Bob Gierkink fired the parting shot five seconds off the buzzer.

Trailing 8-2 going into the third period Cobourg had already lost the game, however, in sheer desperation, and to avoid further humiliation, they hung on and matched the Clippers final three goal tally by Kevin Bartley (from Norm McKenzie), Joe Twinney (from Ken Dix) and an unassisted effort by Rugelis for his hat-trick. It was an inspired

effort by the team, who now find themselves in fourth position in the league standings. Next game in the Clippers schedule is at Port Hope, this evening at 8:00 p.m. On Saturday they play at home against Lindsay, face-off 7:30 p.m., and on Sunday they face Little Britain on their home ice at 1:30 p.m.

Ski fee

CLAREMONT — This season the high price of lift tickets is apparently getting many skiers down. Most area operators have found it necessary to increase their prices to make up for rising costs. Few, however, have found a way to make this increase less painful for the public.

Dagmar Ski Resort, near Claremont, has taken a step to ease the crunch for at least one segment of the skiing public. The resort has introduced a new pricing policy that takes into consideration the skier who doesn't want to spend the entire day on the slopes.

New computerized lift tickets systems will allow skiers to pay for their skiing at Dagmar by the hour. In this way, ski buffs who wish to ski for only a few hours at a time - morning, afternoon, or evening, will not be required to pay the price of a full day ticket.

Resort operator Gabor Marton admits that the system will require extensive supervision on the slopes, but feels that if the new system makes skiing more attractive to the public, the extra effort will pay off not only for the resort, but for the skiers as well.
