CLAREMONT This season the high price of lift tickets is apparently getting many skiers down. Most area operators have found it necessary to increase their-prices to make up for rising costs. Few. however, have found a way to make this increase less painful for the public.

Dagmar Ski Resort, near: Claremont, has taken a step to ease the crunch for at least one segment of the skiing. public. The resort has introduced a new pricing policy that takes into consideration the skier who doesn't want to spend the entire day on the slopes.

New computerized lift tickets systems will allow skiers to pay for their skiing at Dagmar by the hour. In this way, ski buffs who wish to ski for only a few hours at a time - morning, afternoon, or evening, will not be required to pay the price of a full day ticket.

Resort operator Gabor Marton admits that the system will require extensive supervision on the slopes, but feels that if the new system makes skiing more attractive to the public, the extra effort will pay off not only for the resort, but for the skiers as well.


