NIGHT SCHOOL UPDATE

The following are short course descriptions for some of the new courses beginning in January.

TAPESTRY AND RUG MAKING - Judi Von Zuben
(Frame Loom Weaving)
Basic Tapestry and Rug Making techniques will be taught in order that students can apply this craft in wall hangings, pillow covers, hand bags, etc. Creative resources will be stimulated by giving students the experience and satisfaction of working with colour and texture. Student-made portable frame looms will be used.

CALLIGRAPHY - Terry Best
This is a step towards beautiful handwriting and specialized and recognizable scripts. The Canadian Method of handwriting is very impressive to all who can appreciate the beauty of properly formed letter shapes, and one would also be able to design invitations, menus and signs as well as improve messy handwriting.

ELECTRONICS AS A HOBBY - Mike Jenkins
Directed towards the hobbyist, or person who might want to pursue a career in electronics. Includes introduction to electronic devices. Fundamental math as applied to electronics. Introductory practical electronic circuits.

ACTIVITIES FOR THE PRE-SCHOOL CHILD - Mrs. Smith
This 10-week course will provide participants with numerous activity ideas for the pre-school child through practical workshops. The Course will include suggested creative, literary, science oriented, musical and physical activities as well as toy-making ideas. The Programme is geared to the interests of parents, students, baby-sitters and recreational leaders providing practical classroom participation. Material costs - approx. \$10.00.

DOG OBEDIENCE CLASS - Don Rintoul
- NOVICE BEGINNERS - Dog obedience and general training principles, including pet care and management. This involves the solving of any behavioural problems and includes novice obedience exercises.
- NOVICE ADVANCED - only dogs that have gone through a Novice Beginners' course are eligible. Course includes OFF Leash Heeling, Jump Work, Retrieving, Ring procedure and Distance Control.
NOTE: All dogs entered in either course MUST PROVIDE PROOF of up-to-date rabies and parvo virus vaccinations.

DANCING - Chris Simmons
Wednesday night's dancing program will be divided into two parts. The first hour and a half will deal with Latin and Ballroom Dancing. The second hour and a half will be made up of fun and line dances featuring things like the Gay Gordon, Siosh, Alley-cat, Rock and Roll and some square dances or whatever else appeals to the participants. If students do not wish to take part in both sessions, they may sign up for one.

WOOL ART - Chuck Valleau
Covers all techniques of needle and wool from beginners to expert. Materials can be purchased directly from the instructor.

COMMUNICATION SKILLS - Marion Mein
This is a course for adults to help upgrade reading and writing skills. It will also deal with some life skills such as filling out job applications, insurance forms, and many other important necessities.
