Cars collide in 'white-out'

MARKHAM — Highway 7, east of Concession 9, was the scene of two separate accidents December 24, in which four people were injured.
 In the first collision, five cars were damaged and one person was treated for injuries at Scarborough Centenary Hospital, after a pile-up during a white-out.
 Police said it began when a car driven by Paolo Mousilli, 52, of Willowdale, stopped, and was allegedly hit from behind by a car driven by Priscilla Dadsell, 54, of Scarborough.
 Two other cars, driven by Joseph A. Vander, 24, of Scarborough, and Vincent Travers, 27, of Pickering, followed suit. A third car was involved, but drove off.
 Mousilli was released after being treated for injuries. Damage to the cars was light.
 In the second accident, police said a car, driven by Robert Desrocher, 45, of RR 2, Pickering, allegedly pulled out to pass a snowplow and was in collision with a west-bound car driven by Ernest Howard, 55, of RR 1, Locust Hill.
 Mr. Howard and his wife were admitted to Scarborough Hospital with serious injuries.
 Desrocher suffered minor injuries. He's been charged with careless driving.
