MARKHAM — An inquest has been ordered into the death of Bryan R. Hawley, 33, of RR 5, Bowmanville, who was electrocuted while operating a hydro auger truck in a private laneway, near Woodbine and 19th Avenues, Dec. 23.

According to York Regional Police, the deceased, an employee of Power Line Construction Ltd., Markham, was working on a project for Markham Hydro, about 2:30 p.m., when the boom touched a 2,300-volt power line.
