CLAREMONT — Fred Hamilton, a farmer near Brougham more than 50 years, passed away last week. The son of a farmer Mr. Hamilton was born in Pickering Township in 1898. He retired about 14 years ago, and with his wife, Cora went to live in Whitby. Although con-

finied to his home the past few months because of illness, Mr. Hamilton had, for several years, continued to keep his hand in in farming at the homes of his two sons. Besides his wife, he is survived by two daughters, Beula, (Mrs. Donald Duncan) of Brooklin, and Kathleen, (Mrs. Gordon Wagg) of Stouffville; two sons, John of RR 1, Markham, and Ronald, RR 4, Woodville; 13 grandchildren, and a sister, Marie, (Mrs. C.A. Balsdon) of Pickering.

United Church welcomes pastor

STOUFFVILLE — The congregation at Stouffville United Church has a new minister. Rev. Cecil Tiller said his farewells to members at St. Andrew's United Church, Regina, Saskatchewan, Dec. 28; arrived in Stouffville, Jan. 2; presided over his first service here, Jan. 4 and was inducted, Jan. 7. This fast-moving chain of events plus the desire to find a permanent residence, would have left most pastors gasping for breath. But not Rev. Tiller. He appeared completely relaxed as he discussed past experiences and future plans, in the quiet

of his church study. Why Ontario... why Stouffville? Although Bill Hewitt, Brian McFarlane, Dave Hodge and Bob Goldham weren't part of the ministerial selection committee, Hockey Night in Canada helped influence Cecil's decision to move East. He honestly admits to being an enthusiastic Maple Leaf fan and hopes that, by living close to Toronto, he and son Geoff, 12, may be able to see a few games. Both are also avid followers of the Argos and the Blue Jays.

However, he and wife Christine view life in Stouffville from another vantage point. They'll be a few hundred miles closer to their parents, residents of St. John's Newfoundland. Rev. and Mrs. Tiller were both born there. Prior to accepting the charge in Regina, Rev. Tiller served seven years in Saint John, New Brunswick and two years at Winnipeg. In addition to son Geoff, they have a daughter, Janice, age 14. With Stouffville being close to Toronto yet out in the country, Rev. Tiller describes the location as "the best of two worlds". He says his wife and children are looking forward to the move. However, because of Geoff's involvement in

hockey and Janice's desire to finish out her school year, the family may have to divide its time between Regina and Stouffville until June. As to the role he'll play in the church here, Rev. Tiller refers to the nautical understanding of his own name: A bar or handle for turning a boat's rudder. But even in this sense, he establishes limitations. "In his or her own way, each member of the congregation is a minister — we all have something to share with each other," he concluded.

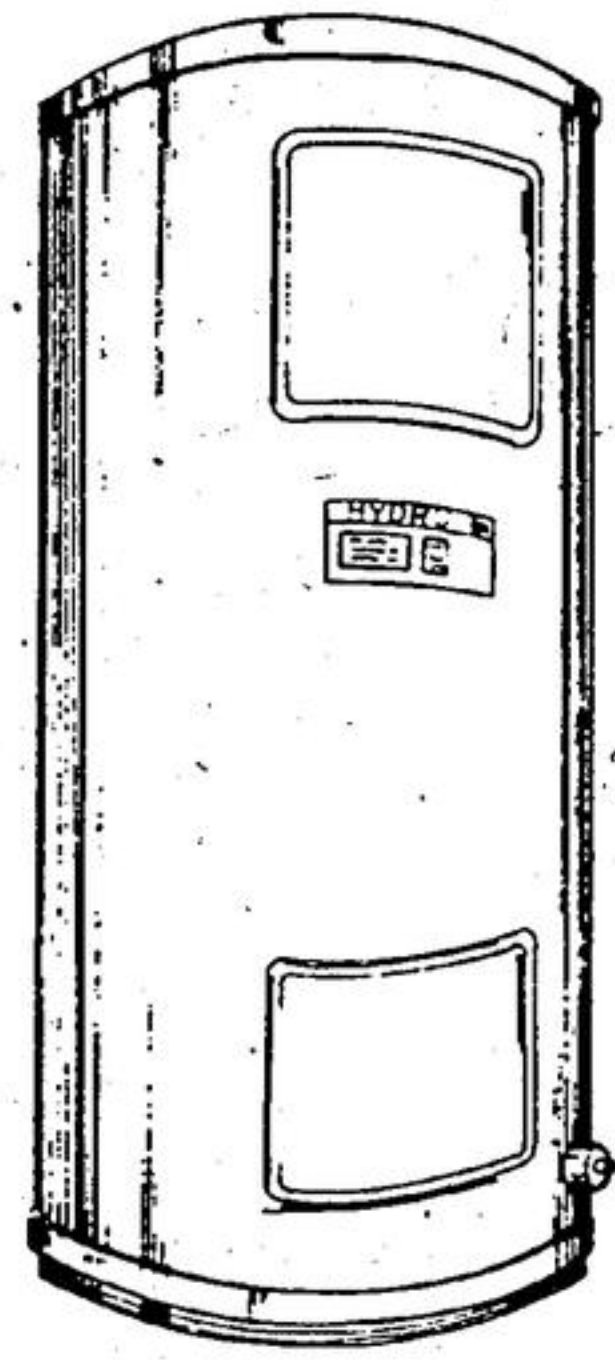
