## Midgets return

**STOUFFVILLE** — Stouffville's Midget hockey team returned from Sweden last Friday with a 2 wins, 3 losses and a 1 tie against their Swedish hosts.

Haninge, the very same team hosted by Stouffville in 1979, revenge their '79 defeat by taking a 5-2 win in the first game of the series, held two days after their visitor's arrival.

The following day, Monday, Stouffville were headed for a 4-3 win against Naika, when a last minute goal by the Swedes; blatantly off-side according to The Tribune scouts, was allowed, making it the only tie of the series. The scoring in this game came from a pair by Barry Green-shields, with singles going to Barry Smith and Mark Murphy. Assists went to Dave Mehaffey, Glen Lewis and Brian Todd.

Game 3 on Dec. 30, saw Stouffville dominate the play and outshoot the opposition. Unfortunately, the Swedish

goalie was impassable; the best the Midgets encountered throughout their trip. Nothing got by him, and the Swedes won comfortably for a 4-0 shutout.

Stouffville's big win came against Soder-talje, with a 9-5 win. Scott Frisby lead the scoring roster with a hat-trick while Barry Green-shields and Dave Mehaffey picked up pairs. Singles went to Barry Smith and Brian Todd. Earning assists were; Tim Yeomans (2), Brian Todd (3), Dave Mehaffey (3) Garry Teggart, Dale Leger, Mike Howard and Glen Lewis.

Against the Swedish All-star Huddinge team, in game five, on Jan. 4, the Midgets were hampered 7-1; their only goal coming from Mike Howard, an assist from Barry Green-shields and Dave Mehaffey.

The Midgets left their mark by winning their final game, against Nunasam, on Jan. 6. The game was played in zero

degree weather on the shores of the Baltic sea, with a snowstorm thrown in for good measure. Goals by Mike Howard and Barry Green-shields (from Dave Mehaffey) gave them a close 2-1 win over their rivals.

Al Fockler and John Carrick shared net-minding duties throughout the tour, putting in fine performances against some very polished opponents.

According to Midget team manager Mick Redshaw, the Swedes are disciplined positional players - as are most European teams - and it is necessary to check them before they start moving. They also take their fair share of penalties and are excellent stick handlers. Even so, they are as adept at "holding" as their Canadian counterparts.

One thing that stood out in the minds of the Canadian visitors was that all changing facilities and showers are separate from the arena building.

### Notice of Public Meeting INTERPROVINCIAL TRUCKING RECIPROACITY

Commercial Vehicle owners who operate their trucks between Ontario and other Canadian provinces are invited to attend a public meeting to discuss the new Canadian Agreement on Vehicle Registration (CAVR). This agreement will allow fleet owners and individual operators to operate within all provinces in the plan by purchasing a single registration plate in Ontario, and fees will be based on distance travelled in each jurisdiction.

Ontario, Manitoba, Saskatchewan, Alberta, British Columbia and New Brunswick will implement the plan on April 1, 1981. Quebec, Nova Scotia, and Newfoundland will offer licence reciprocity sometime in 1982.

The meeting will take place on Thursday, January 22, 7:00 p.m., at the Skyline Hotel, Continental Room, 655 Dixon Road, Rexdale, Ontario.
