**Loans made easier**

**STOUFFVILLE** — There's good news all around the applicants eligible for loans under the Ontario Home Renewal Program.

Not only has the maximum adjustable family income for applicants gone up from \$12,500 to \$15,500, there's \$60,000 in the kitty for such disbursements in the Town of Whitchurch - Stouffville.

That was the amount quoted by Mayor Elected King at a meeting of

council last week, following discussion of a letter from the Ministry of Housing announcing the increase.

Possibility of the latter was first announced June 9, 1980. As a result, the Ministry said that, any applications received after that time from those whose adjusted family income did not exceed \$15,500, could be entertained "without the necessity of requiring a homeowner to fill out a new application."
