Dog found by officer

STOUFFVILLE — A Stouffville couple and their Toronto friends are saying "thanks" this week to Judy Barrett, the Town's canine control officer for returning "Piper" safe and sound.

George and Ruthann Barr had driven out from the city for a visit with Bill and Betty Parsons, Hwy. 47, RR 2, Stouffville. They brought "Piper", a small black Scotch terrier along.

During their stay, they let the dog out for a romp in the yard, forgetting that spring fever among canines can strike early in the country. Within five minutes, he was gone.

"We looked everywhere," Betty told The Tribune, "our friends were very upset."

When not a trace of Piper could be found, a call was put in to canine control at Stouffville. Officer Judy Barrett took down the information.

Two days later, on her way home from work, she spotted a dog meeting Piper's description alongside the road. She coaxed him into the van, took him to a vet, then called the Parsons. Betty immediately relayed the good news to her friends in Toronto.

"He was in a terrible mess, all covered with burrs, she said.

However, it's now back to 'a dog's life' in Toronto where, presumably, everybody's happy. Unfortunately, Piper can't talk, or he might relate a different story.

To rebuild Bruce's mill

GORMLEY — The historic 120 year old mill at Bruce's Conservation Area, is to be restored.

The Metro Toronto and Region Conservation Foundation is engaged in a \$72,000 fund-raising campaign to rehabilitate

the structure to its 1910 period.

When completed, visitors will be able to stand on the main floor and see the mill in operation. They will also have access to the second floor.

Over the past nineteen years, this organization has raised more than three million dollars for a broad range of conservation activities.
